SANTA CLARA

D4 team members attended Reclaiming Our Downtown meetings on **March 6, 13, 20** and **27** to hear the growing discussion around the rebuilding of Santa Clara's downtown. The group recently celebrated the city's hiring of an urban planner to revitalize the downtown.

On **March 21**, D4 team members attended a Walking Tour of Agnew Neighborhood, where city staff sought input from pedestrians about how improvements, urban design and connectivity can make Santa Clara a more walkable city.

The Reed Neighborhood Association held their first meeting on **March 18**. At the meeting, the safety and events committees were created.

Two community forums were held by the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority about the Bascom Corridor Complete Streets Study on **March 27** and **March 28**. My staff was in attendance at both meetings, listening to the study, which evaluates 5.9 miles of Bascom Avenue regarding travel time, signal coordination, signal timing, multi-modal access, safety and connectivity.
