A Day in the Life of the Intern

*It is the Lord who goes before you. He will be with you;
he will not fail you or forsake you. Do not fear or be dismayed.
-Deuteronomy 31:8*

This text from the book of Deuteronomy comes at a pivotal point in the lives of the people of Israel. After journeying through the desert for 40 years, the people have finally reached the promised land, and are about to enter a new world. The leader who had brought them out of Egypt, and led them through the desert, Moses, has been told that he will not be entering the promised land with them. The people of Israel do not know what this promised land will look like, how the leadership structures will work out from this point on, or what to expect when they get to the other side. In hopes of preparing them for the journey that lies ahead of them, Moses leaves them with the message that is quoted above.

I will never forget when I first found out that my placement for internship was going to be walking alongside all of you here at Peace. When I first told Anna that we were going to be in Montana for the year, she was literally jumping for joy because she was so incredibly excited. I was thrilled with the placement as well. I had heard wonderful things from Melissa about the ministries of both Peace and St. John's, about the staff at both locations, and about how amazing the people were. While excitement was definitely the primary emotion I was feeling, there were some things that I was nervous about as well. Billings would be the furthest I had ever lived from my family and friends, and I had only spent one year living outside of the state of Minnesota. I had never been to Montana, and I had only ever even spent an hour or two in the Mountain Time Zone which was on a layover in Denver. I had never worked with an organization like St. John's, and I had never worked with a congregation the size of Peace. While I was incredibly excited to meet all of you, there were so many things that were unknown.

The message that Moses gave to the people of Israel held true for me as well in my move to Billings. The Lord did indeed go before me, and God met me in each and every one of you. You have been so incredibly welcoming, encouraging, and supportive during my time here. I have been overwhelmed by the love that I have felt in my interactions with you all, and I have seen God meet me in my interactions with each and every one of you. I have learned and grown in ways that I could not have imagined through doing life and ministry alongside you all, and I cannot thank you enough for the gift that this year has been.

Walking alongside all of you has taught me so much about what it means to be a Pastor, and about what it means to live out the calling that God has for each of us. Your heart for the neighbors and ways that you always step up to serve the people around you has been incredibly inspiring, and has warmed my heart. Your passion for worship, and experiencing different styles and liturgies has opened my eyes to new ways that God shows up in our midst. The community and relationships that you have formed together as a people of Peace Lutheran Church has been exemplary, and has set a high bar for what I hope the congregations I will serve in the future will look like. I want to give a special word of thanks to my internship committee who have done an incredible job of encouraging me, challenging me, and helping me to discern who God has called me to be as Pastor. June 5th & 6th Second Weekend after Pentecost "A House United"

Readings: Genesis 3:8-15; Psalm 130; 2 Corinthians. 4:13-5:1; **Mark 3:20-35**

What does it mean that we are all one family of God? Jesus claims his followers and disciples as his family in this text, and claims that a house divided cannot stand. How do we live out our calling as brothers and sisters in Christ?

Words from the Bishop:

“Calling”

What does it mean to be called by God? This is a season of graduations, whether from college, high school or kindergarten, and many seniors or their parents may be wondering about what is next in their lives. “Where is God calling me to go? Who is God calling me to be? What is God calling me to do?” These are questions our graduates as well as many of the rest of us post-pandemic may be asking as we move through transitions in life.

One misconception church members tend to have is that only pastors and missionaries are called. Or that God calls us to only serve the church on Sunday mornings and gives us the rest of our lives with which to do whatever we want outside of the church. We as Christians have too often separated our callings into Church (which God cares about) and the rest of life (which we mistakenly think doesn’t really matter to God). But that’s just not true.

Now don’t get me wrong. God indeed calls people to serve Christ’s Church and its mission in a variety of ways: pastors, deacons, LPAs, musicians, council officers/members, committee members, youth leaders, chaplains, Stephens Ministers, Bible study leaders, theologians, teachers, and the list can go on and on. I give thanks for each one of you who continue to serve faithfully in these callings across the church in the MT Synod and the ELCA. Your ministry is very much appreciated!

But we need more! The church is currently in great need of people to serve the church as pastoral leaders. In particular, the need for pastors and LPAs to serve congregations in the Montana Synod is overwhelming.

At this moment, we have far more openings in congregations than we have available pastors to fill those openings. And this is happening across the church in many denominations. We as church together are going to have to find innovative and creative ways to do ministry that might involve changing how we think about what it means to

be church in order to fulfill God’s ongoing call to proclaim the gospel, equip followers of Christ, and serve the neighbor in these places.

But in the meantime, we need more people to listen for and seriously consider the Holy Spirit’s call to be a pastoral leader. There are so many ways to seek ordained ministry now, for example the three candidates who went through the TEEM program and will be ordained in the next two months. Congratulations Tim Tharp (Savage/Skarr), Wendy McAlpine (Sunburst) and Cheryl Muncy (Joplin) and thank you for your willingness to serve the mission of Christ’s gospel in the MT Synod!

There’s also the LPA program in the MT Synod which is going to start up again in the fall and will only be getting stronger as we prepare lay leaders to serve their congregations. Thank you to all of our LPAs who contribute to the life of the church in so many ways. We in MT wouldn’t be where we are without you!

In the end, though, Jesus’ call to follow him directs us out from the church into the world in which we live. In and through the church we are empowered to live as disciples -- “followers of Christ” – in every nook and cranny of our lives, no matter where we are, who we are, or what we’re doing.

The Spirit’s call does send us into our congregations to be nourished, equipped, encouraged and inspired by the gospel message of “new life in Christ for you.” But then we are called out of our congregations to bring Christ’s gospel into our communities, our state, our nation, and our world whomever we are, and whatever we say, think, feel and do.

So as we emerge from the limitations of the pandemic, think about what God may be calling you to seek, be and do with your lives to serve Christ’s gospel. And may the Holy Spirit inspire you always to follow Jesus’ call wherever it may lead.

God’s blessings be with all who are graduating this season as you transition into the next part of your lives.

7 Give thanks that — through grace, faith in Christ and obedience to the will and ways of God — we are embraced as children of God, siblings in Christ.

20 Pray that God's power, presence and love will ease our fears and uncertainties, calm the storms in our lives and strengthen our faith so that we will be bold and tireless disciples who do God's work in the world, share the gospel and serve our neighbor.

21 Remember in prayer fathers who strive to be loving, caring, wise and influential parents, including fathers who are new parents or single parents, who are deployed in the military or incarcerated, or who experience separation from family while traveling for their work.

25 Pause today and take in the wonders of God's creation. Give thanks for the joy, wonder and awesome complexity of nature and the universe, and ask God to help us be mindful, responsible and respectful stewards of creation.

26 Remember in prayer the leaders, voting members and others gathering online for the South Carolina Synod Assembly, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and encourage them in choosing leaders, proclaiming the gospel, growing the church, serving our neighbor and doing God's work in an ever-changing world.

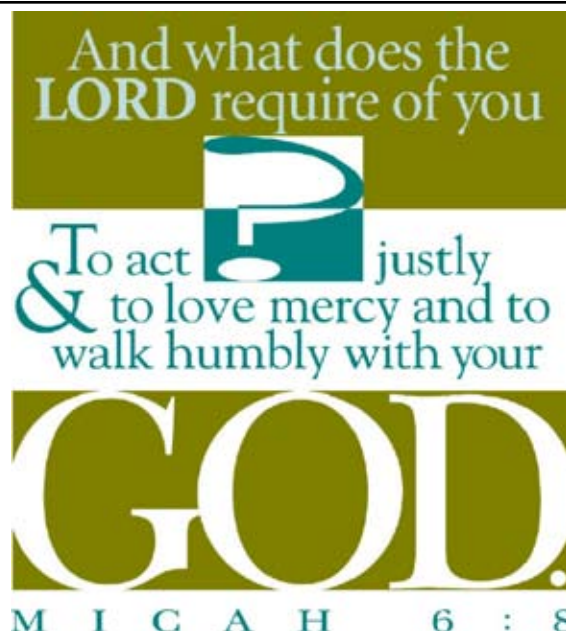
27 Pray that we will serve our neighbors and invite others to believe and to join our communities of faith without bias, judgment, hesitation, obstruction or condition.
