I feel like we just celebrated the Holidays together and here we are getting ready to enter the month of March!

For us WNY'ers I'm not sure another month is more perfectly placed during the Lenten season as the month of March. To be most honest, I despise March. The long dreary days filled with who knows what weather, teasing us that spring is around the corner but still so far away...This year it's especially dreary and heavy as we celebrate the 1 year passing of my little sister. Hard to believe.

We just celebrated Ash Wednesday where we began a 40 day journey of identifying with Jesus as he entered the desert for 40 days and nights to fast and pray. If you remember, this took place

right after his baptism. When he ended his 40 days in the wilderness he would publicly start his ministry and long journey to the cross. Hungry and tempted by Satan to lay down his humanity for divinity, Jesus refused to prove his power and circumvent the path to the cross.

For some reason, I was led to look up the definition of March outside of its association with the month. I found this...

March - to proceed or advance inexorably (in a way that is impossible to stop or prevent)

This is exactly what the mission of Jesus looked like as he emerged from the 40 days. He exited these 40 days of solitude and definitively walked to the tune of his Father's will at all costs, even to the point of death on a cross.

During Lent we are invited to reflect on and deepen our understanding of our brokenness and limitations as humans and acknowledge our great need for saving. We mourn our sin and look again and again to God to empower us to turn from what drags us down from living a life of freedom, and hurts us, one another, and the world we live in. Let's be honest, like March this can feel kind of dreary.

But like spring always faithfully shows up, because of the faithfulness of God, we can emerge with a greater love, gratitude, joy and hope for the rescue that is ours! We look forward to Easter where we celebrate how Jesus rescued us from sin and death by going to the cross and overcame evil and the grave once and for all, making a way for us to come before a Holy God now and for all of eternity.

Typically, through prayer, fasting (abstaining from something to reduce distractions and focus more on God) and giving, or charity we turn from our selfish and self absorbed ways and align ourselves with the Father's will for our life.

We declare yet again that his mercy, grace and love is enough! Like the crocus that arrives first thing in spring we emerge from the cold, hard ground of our sin and grow towards new light, warmth and love of the Son.
