

Volunteer Advisory Council Update

The Volunteer Advisory Council (VAC) met on February 27th to discuss topics that effect all volunteers. The meeting started on a high note; Priscilla Eckert, a Monday 1st guide, mentor, tour guide, and husbandry volunteer, joined the VAC. Priscilla's multiple roles make her a great addition to the Council. The main focus of the meeting was a discussion with guest speaker Craig Gundlach, the Director of Security and Emergency Preparedness, who spoke on the Aquarium's response to Coronavirus. This initial conversation between the Security office and the volunteer leaders of VAC informed the subsequent communications with all MBA volunteers about the COVID-19 virus, the key safety considerations, as well as temporary leave options for volunteers. The information gathered during this meeting has been disseminated over the last few weeks.



As you may recall, the VAC has three main areas of focus for 2020: Exhibits, Climate Change and DEI (diversity, equity, and inclusion). The Council discussed the Aquarium's participation in "Climate Crisis and Action: A discussion with Californian Leadership", an event that was held at MIIS on February 19th.
