Presenter: **Dr. Clay Cook**

Dr. Clay Cook is the John and Nancy Peyton Faculty Fellow in Child and Adolescent Wellbeing at the University of Minnesota and Associate Professor in the School Psychology Program. He has extensive research and practical experiences involving the implementation of evidence-based programs and practices to promote children's social, emotional, and behavioral wellbeing as the foundation for academic and life success. In addition to his research, he consults with several school and community systems throughout the US to improve practices and outcomes for students to meet the demands of civic, work, and home life.



We will:

- discuss why a nurturing and responsive school environment is critical to promote student's social, emotional, and behavioral wellbeing as the foundation for academic and life success.
- emphasize that changes in adult behavior (that is, the things adults say and do with students and one another) to cultivate a culture and climate represents how a school creates a nurturing and responsive environment.
- describe how to use implementation science to advance the successful implementation of common language and practices among educators to alter school culture and climate in the service of creating a nurturing and responsive environment.

8:30am - 9:45am: ESSA: Minnesota's New Accountability System and What it Means for My School

Presenter: Stephanie Graff, Minnesota Department of Education



The Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) worked extensively with stakeholders across the state to develop a new accountability and support system under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). The system will go into effect in the 2018-19 school year. Participants in this session will have an opportunity to learn about the indicators in the state's new system, including achievement, progress toward English language proficiency, graduation rates and consistent attendance as well as the process that will be used to identify schools and districts for support. This session will also include information on the timeline for accountability and

support as we move into the 2018-19 school year as well as an opportunity for participants to share and ask questions about what this means for local schools and communities across the state.

Stephanie is Chief Accountability Officer at MDE and oversees the work of the Office of Equity and Opportunity. This team provides leadership and support for school and district efforts focused on equitable opportunities and outcomes for all of Minnesota's students. This includes state and federal accountability efforts under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), district World's Best Workforce planning, and the Achievement and Integration program.
