



Hartford County Bar Association presents: Update on New Laws and Rules For Attorneys and Clients

This annual CLE program will provide an overview of new laws enacted by the Connecticut General Assembly and Practice Book changes recently adopted by the judges of the Superior Court. It is ideal for solo, small firm and general practitioners.

A panel consisting of two lawyer-legislators, the Governor's general counsel and a Superior Court judge will discuss:

- Recent new laws affecting various practice areas such as civil and criminal law and justice, public health, construction, consumer protection, energy and environment, insurance and real estate, labor and employment, municipalities and transportation, many of which take effect Oct. 1, 2019.
- The state budget and taxes and spending for state agencies and programs. Impact of the budget on Superior Court staffing, operations and services for attorneys and clients.
- New Superior Court rules concerning civil practice and procedure and revisions to the Rules of Professional Conduct, many of which take effect Jan. 1, 2020; update on minimum continuing legal education.
- What to expect from the General Assembly and state government in 2020 for legislation, the state budget, policies and rules concerning civil law, practice and procedure.

This program will provide all attorneys with practical information to remain current and informed about new laws, policies and recent changes to the rules of practice.
