WHAT IS NEW AND NOTEWORTHY IN SPRING 2018?	
<p>Centennial High School achieved a 92 percent graduation rate in 2017, exceeding the Fulton County goal of 90 percent.</p> <p>Average SAT (1109) and ACT (24) scores for 2016-2017 are at an all-time high and exceed the national and Fulton County average.</p> <p>55 students are in dual-enrollment, taking college-level courses for simultaneous credit towards high school and college graduation requirements.</p> <p>Centennial students are accepted into world-class schools. We have had 6 students in the last five years admitted to Harvard; including 2 on full scholarships in 2017. Over 70 students were accepted at UGA, well over the state average.</p>	Centennial is competitive within Fulton County, the state of Georgia and the country.

Students are now utilizing an amazing new array of work spaces. Teachers from all departments are leveraging the flexibility these enhanced spaces offer. These modern classrooms better engage students with opportunities to work both in a group or independently within the same space. All revamped classrooms are a depiction of the school-wide initiative to integrate active student participation into all classes. Examples include working at a daycare center for Syrian immigrants and hosting a cross-cultural movie night; problem-solving for Love Beyond Walls and MAP18, projects associated with homelessness and poverty; delivered 150 food packets to Atlanta/Fulton area food shelters • Student Leadership Johns Creek recruits approximately 45 students each year from 4 high schools for a 2-year leadership program. Centennial Athletics continues to thrive. Highlights include: <u>2017-2018</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sophomore Cathryn Gray was named 2017 U.S. Paralympics All-American in two events. Varsity Football Region 7 AAAAAA Runner Up; Advanced to Sweet 16 of GHSA AAAAAA State Playoffs, winning its first state playoff game since 2002 under new head coach Michael Perry. Broke the single season scoring record with 445 points, had six 1st Team All-Region players. Our QB was named North Georgia Touchdown Club's Offensive Player of the Year. Girls Varsity Volleyball advanced to the Sweet 16 of GHSA AAAAAA State Playoffs for the first time since 2013. CHS Swim and Dive team finished 4th at the County meet, setting a meet record in the Girls 200 Medley Relay. THE BIG PICTURE: CHARTER SYSTEM AND WHAT IT ALLOWS US TO DO	
Fulton County Schools became Georgia's largest charter system in July 2012. Fulton County is one of four metro area charter school systems (Atlanta Public Schools, Marietta City and Decatur City are the others)—out of only 42 that exist in the state .	Being in a charter system is good for my student—it allows flexibility to meet the needs of our community.
Furthermore, Centennial High School was one of the first schools to embrace the charter system within Fulton County.	Centennial High School has proven experience in leveraging the charter system model for the benefit of its student population. CHS faculty and staff are prepared to think outside the box to engage every student to their full potential.
Schools in the charter system are led by a School Governance Council.	Having a School Governance Council means I can have direct influence on my school. The school is led by a team of elected parents, teachers, local community members, and school administrators. All of them are very invested in doing what is best for students.
As part of the charter system, curriculum changes can be made to support each school's strategic plans (if approved by the Fulton County Board). Two of the more innovative waivers that Centennial High School has been granted include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Internship Waiver: Work-based learning experiences can be selected as a part of a student's chosen course curriculum to develop skills and prepare them to be successful professionals in the workplace. • Personal Fitness Waiver: Students in varsity sports, JROTC, marching band or other approved club sports (fencing) can waive taking Personal Fitness and replace that class time with electives and additional academic options suited to each person's unique college and career path. 	Centennial High School provides innovative ways to maximize the individual learning experience to meet the needs of its student body.
Another tremendous benefit of the Fulton County Charter System is its Seed Fund/Charter System Grant Program . The Seed Fund was established in 2013 using \$7.8 million appropriated by the Georgia State Legislature to support the Fulton County Charter System. Centennial High School has successfully navigated the rigorous application process to improve the school, including winning over \$700,000 in grants in 5 years. Key highlights:	Centennial High School has been a leader in creating big ideas that effect positive change for its students. It has won significant seed money to invest in new programs that benefit my student using existing taxpayer dollars, versus my having to pay for a private school environment or capital campaign.

Principal Kibbey Crumbley has been leading Centennial High School for over five years with a strong team Administrative team. Under her leadership, the school continues to improve and excel.	It is reassuring to know that my student will be at a school with a consistent, talented, dedicated and strong administrative team—which makes all the difference in a school's success.
Centennial High School is on track to become an International Baccalaureate (IB) World School , a designation that is recognized globally. It will be the only high school in the Northeast Learning Community in Fulton County to have this designation. We anticipate offering the IB Diploma Programme courses to juniors in the fall of 2018 . International Baccalaureate (IB) schools aim to go beyond traditional curriculum by developing inquiring, knowledgeable, and caring young people motivated to succeed. IB offers a continuum of programs from elementary through high school. The programs encourage both personal and academic achievement, challenging students in their studies and personal development.	The IB program can be a huge opportunity for my student and Centennial High School will be one of only four IB high schools in Fulton County to offer this program. My student can earn a diploma recognized by colleges and universities around the world.
In April 2016, Centennial High School became one of the first in the State of Georgia to offer the International Skills Diploma Seal . Less than 7 percent of the 956 Georgia high schools currently offer this seal to graduating seniors.	My student has an opportunity to differentiate him/herself in the college application process through this rigorous program, as well as become better prepared for operating in a global environment.
Centennial High School offers an International Relations elective and hosts a nationally-acclaimed Model United Nations team . The school is a leader in the nation with its Model UN program and the only school in Georgia named in the Top 150 Model UN programs . Other local high schools have visited the Centennial program to learn from its successes. Centennial also hosts a Middle School Model UN event each year to encourage middle schoolers interest in global issues.	Centennial is focused on preparing its students to understand world issues and has added an International Relations class to its curriculum as well as supporting a vibrant and competitive Model UN Club. *Note that middle school students attending Holcomb Bridge Middle School can join its Model UN Club before even attending Centennial H.S.
Centennial H.S. offers the Army JROTC program , a three-year Career Pathways course that strives to build life skills and strong citizens. It is one of only two programs in North Fulton and is award-winning. Established in 1997, roughly the year the school opened, the program continues to flourish. Recent activities include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • JROTC Color Guard presented the National Colors at over 15 events at school and in the community 	My student could benefit from and enjoy Army JROTC—which contrary to the popular myth—is not a military-feeder program but a 3-year elective program that builds life skills and citizenship.

<p>Centennial High School offers the Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) program, one that Principal Kibbey Crumbley brought to Fulton County three years ago and which has been adopted by the core Centennial High School feeder schools (Esther Jackson, Hillside, Northwood, River Eves, Haynes Bridge, Holcomb Bridge).</p> <p>AVID is a College Readiness System that transforms leadership, instruction, and culture to focus on the academic and social skills needed in higher education and beyond. Schools implementing AVID operate with a guiding principle: hold students to the highest standards, provide academic and social support, and they will rise to the challenge.</p> <p>AVID builds a college-going culture by bringing best practices and methodologies to middle and high school students.</p>	<p>Centennial was the first AVID certified high school in Fulton County.</p> <p>The Centennial School Cluster is one of the only AVID-certified clusters in the entire state.</p> <p>AVID could be a wonderful program for my student. AVID has increased both graduation rates and the number of college-bound students.</p> <p>The Centennial High School administration and School Governance Council are committed to bringing the best programs available to its student population.</p>
