Both nationally and in California reports, African Americans are identified as having some of the lowest rates of having ever breastfeeding, initiating breastfeeding and/or exclusively breastfeeding. Lack of knowledge regarding African American women's historical trauma and current race-related micro-stressors, and the impacts these have on maternal health and breastfeeding, prevents providers from adequately addressing the needs of the community. This presentation will focus on increasing the cultural sensitivity and humility of providers, in an effort to promote culturally responsive and informed care and support services for African Americans.

Objectives

Following the didactic presentations, participants will be able to:

- Describe how historical trauma has impacted African American birth and breastfeeding outcomes.
- Describe how race-related micro-stressors impact African American birth and breastfeeding outcomes.
- Detect, identify and assess for significant vulnerabilities and strengths among African American women, which can impact breastfeeding.
- Detect, identify and assess for significant barriers to breastfeeding among African Americans women.
- Construct support strategies and interventions for African American breastfeeding mothers.
