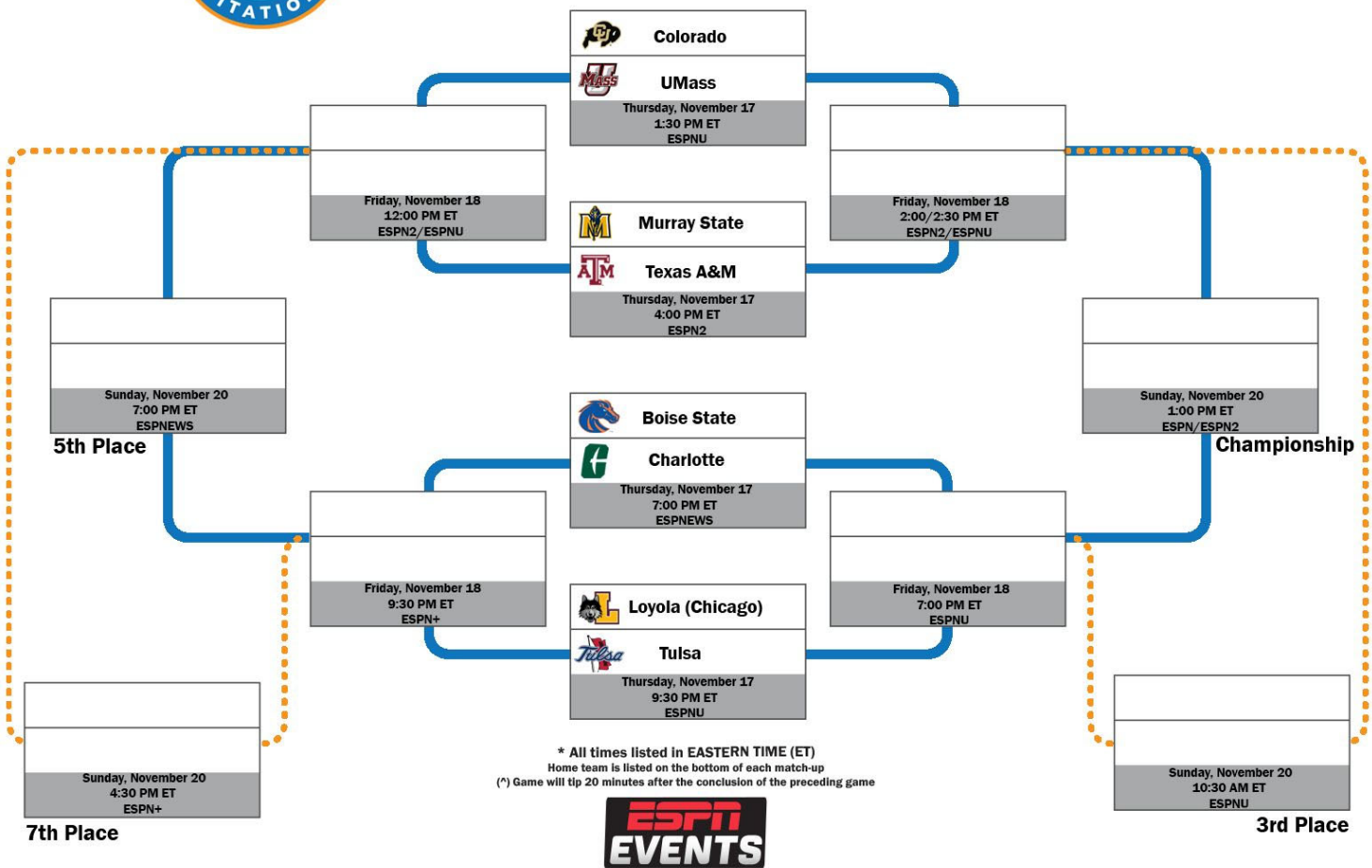

NOTES

The HTC Center also hosted the **2017 Puerto Rico Tipoff** when Iowa State defeated **Boise State** 75-64 two capture the title. The Broncos defeated UTEP 58-56 and Illinois State 82-64 to reach the finals.

Boise State will be playing for the second-straight November in the state of South Carolina and the fourth-time overall. At the 2016 Charleston Classic, the Broncos lost to host Charleston 60-47 in the quarterfinals before splitting a pair of consolation games by losing 80-68 to Mississippi State and defeating Western Michigan 91-70.

Boise State won two of three games at last November's Charleston Classic by losing 67-61 to eventual champions St. Bonaventure in the quarter-finals before winning twice in the consolation rounds to Temple 82-62 and Ole Miss 60-50.

Charlotte (2010 and 2014) has competed twice in the Charleston Classic while **Colorado** (2012), **Tulsa** (2011) and **UMass** (2014) have appeared once each. Before placing second at the 2014 Charleston event after losing 77-58 to Miami of Florida in the finals, Charlotte placed sixth in 2010.

Colorado and **UMass** won back-to-back Charleston Classic titles with the Buffs defeating **Murray State** 81-74 for the 2012 crown and UMass downing Clemson 62-56 for the 2013 championship.

The eight schools have combined for 725 seasons of competition 10,386 wins and a 55.2 winning percentage. The schools have a combined 99 **NCAA** and 70 **NIT** appearances. **Loyola Chicago** won the 1963 NCAA Championships and the 2015 CBI crown. The Ramblers were the runners-up at the 1939 and 1049 NITs. **Colorado** (1940) and **Tulsa** (1981, 2001) have captured NIT titles. **Tulsa** won the 2008 CBI title and **Murray State** the 2012 CBI crown. **Charlotte** (1976) and **Texas A&M** (2022) were NIT runner-ups.
