Judicial Nominating Commissions

The Governor appoints the lay members of the Judicial Nominating Commissions (JNCs). Lay members cannot be attorneys. Attorneys are appointed to the Commission by the judicial branch. JNCs interview applicants for

judge positions and forward names for consideration to the Governor. No more than half of the members can be of any one political party.
