Welcome New Members: Jim Adams and Dennis Hill were received into membership by the Session this morning.

Jim Adams was born in Missouri and raised in Tennessee. He is retired (travel and pharmaceutical industries) and currently teaches English as a Second Language (ESL) at Durham Tech. Jim is a graduate of Vanderbilt and Duke universities and enjoys spending time with friends, traveling, American Sign Language, yoga, and politics. He joins FPC by reaffirmation of faith.

Dennis Hill was born in Kannapolis, NC. He is an ordained minister and retired pastor, having served locally at Mount Carmel Baptist Church in Chapel Hill. The *sanctuary table* upon which the Advent Wreath sits was made by *George Danser* and is given to the church by him and his wife, *Jean Cary*. George has drawn design features from our communion table and used oak removed from the sanctuary during our renovation and from a tree in their backyard that Jean saw get hit by lightning some years ago.

Advent paraments: In 2012, First Presbyterian Church commissioned internationally known fiberartist Laurie Wohl to design and create two paraments to be hung from the pulpit and lectern during Lent and Advent. The Advent text on the pulpit parament, in Hebrew and English, is from Isaiah 12:3: "With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation." The Advent text on the lectern parament is from Luke 1:78-79: "The dawn from on high will break upon us to give light to guide our feet into the way of peace." We are grateful that the bequest of Anne 'St. Clair' Williams made it possible to enhance our sanctuary with these beautiful works of art.




