Reformation Sunday: You will notice that the liturgical color for Reformation Sunday is red. Red is used on days which invoke the Holy Spirit (Ordinations, Installations, Pentecost). We affirm the Holy Spirit's movement in the church "Ecclesia reformat, semper reformanda" that is, "the church reformed, always reforming." Red is also the color which reminds us of the blood of martyrs and all those who died for the cause of purifying the Church and espousing the truth that we are saved by grace alone, and not through our works. —Kathy Parkins



First Presbyterian Church: Lunch & Learn with Peter Storey


Monday, November 7, 12:00-2:00p.m.

First Presbyterian Church in Durham is hosting Peter Storey for a lunch and interview about his life and ministry.

Storey was the Presiding Bishop of the Methodist Church of Southern Africa and President of the South African Council of Churches, working alongside Desmond Tutu during the height of the anti-apartheid struggle. He was chaplain to Nelson Mandela on Robben Island and integrated churches in Cape Town and Johannesburg, providing healing and hope against the ravages of the apartheid regime.

At the end of the event, there will be a book signing of his recently published memoir, Protest at Midnight: Ministry to a Nation Torn Apart.






