The *Lenten Banner* was completed in 1990 and dedicated in 1991. It depicts traditional Lenten symbols. The banner was made possible by funds donated in memory of *Bess Bryant* and by the stitching of many devoted members of this congregation.

The *Pulpit Paraments*: In 2012 First Presbyterian Church commissioned Laurie Wohl to design and create paraments to be hung from the pulpit and lectern during Lent and Advent. Wohl is an internationally known fiber artist who exhibited her work at the church in spring of 2012. Her liturgical projects emphasize the "threads that bind" and the unity of the Old and New Testaments. We are grateful that the bequest of *Anne 'St. Clair' Williams* made it possible to enhance our sanctuary with these beautiful works of art.



- 1) A calendar (https://www.presbyterianmission.org/resource/tread-lightly-for-lent) to help you tread lightly for Lent. We move with folks towards sustainable choices that restore and protect all of God's children and creation. In Lent, we slow down, take time, and examine our internal spiritual lives and the way we live out our Christian faith in the world around us. These actions are intended to create more mindful behaviors throughout the year.
- 2) Several members are practicing a greener Lent (https://greenerlent.org/fast.html), a Laudato Si-inspired Lenten Program focused on care for our earth and the poor. This entails 40 days of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving for the poor disproportionately affected by the climate crisis.


