On July 4:

The citizens of Israel recognized David's greatness and anointed him as king. The citizens of Nazareth were amazed at Jesus' deeds and actions, but refused to believe in him. How do we respond in the presence of greatness? And what do these stories have to say about our own ways of choosing leaders?

On July 11: Today's readings present two contrasting examples of exuberant dancing: David dances before the Lord as he leads the ark into Jerusalem, and Herod's daughter dances before her father's guests at a banquet. In each case the celebration has unexpected consequences, as old grudges are exposed.
