Advent paraments: In 2012, First Presbyterian Church commissioned internationally known fiberartist Laurie Wohl to create paraments to be hung in the sanctuary during Lent and Advent. We are grateful that the bequest of Anne 'St. Clair' Williams made it possible to enhance our sanctuary with these beautiful works of art.
