

Holy Week Services

Wednesday, March 31, 7:00 p.m. (in sanctuary and online)

Tenebrae

Think of this as a kind of Holy Week Evening Prayer service. We begin in darkness (Tenebrae means “shadows”) with the light of several candles. Gradually, each is extinguished until there is only one left. This unique service is a powerful way to meditate on the life of Christ as we remember his passion during Holy Week.

Thursday, April 1, 7:00 p.m. (online)

Maundy Thursday with the Washing of Feet

Gathering online, this time of worship will contemplate the Last Supper, where Jesus gave the New Commandment to love one another, washing his disciples’ feet as a sign of the loving service he has called us to. Prepare a bowl of water and a clean towel for yourself and members of your household.

Friday, April 2, 12:00 p.m. (outdoor)

Stations of the Cross

Join us for a family-inclusive time of worship. This adaptation of the Stations of the Cross is based on the readings from Mark’s Gospel, brought to life by Holy Week Prayer Flags made by our kid members, and taking place outside. Walk on holy ground with us as we remember Christ’s love and the events of his passion.

Good Friday

This traditional service incorporates a set of prayers called the Solemn Collects. As we reflect on the event of Jesus’s death, we’re invited to venerate the holy symbol of the Cross which carries both the ultimate sign of our sin and brokenness as well as the ultimate sign of God’s love for us.

Great Vigil

In response to the events of Christ’s suffering and death, and in anticipation of his rising to life again, we spend time in the sacred ritual of retelling the stories of God’s salvation before renewing our Baptismal Covenant.

Easter

We celebrate the Resurrection and our Lord’s triumph over death itself, and raise the joy of his everlasting presence with the celebration of Holy Eucharist.
