FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF SALMON

Founded in 1903, the Presbyterians finished their building in 1906. When the Methodist church lost their building during the great depression they became a federated congregation until 1949.

Though the churches went their separate ways, the two congregations have continued to work together.
