The Boundary End Center is a Nonprofit residential research library, beautifully located at the entrance of the Big Ivy section of the Pisgah National Forest, Barnardsville. The library is specialized in the archaeology, colonial history, and ethnology of the Pre-Columbian Americas, especially the Maya area, the Andean World, and the U.S. Southeast.

We are open from 9am-7pm, 7 days a week. The library is also open for anyone seeking to do research, and offers two working stations and a kitchenette.
