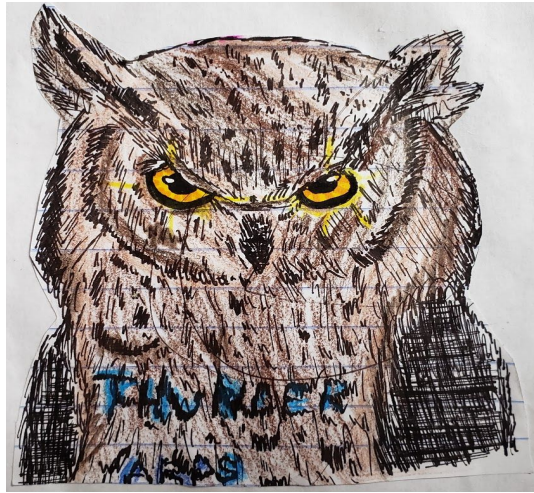

Disguises is a costume store in Lakewood, Colorado, it has all kinds of cool costumes, masks, makeup, wigs, and special effects. The wigs have a variety to them, some are colorful and some are more natural looking! They feel soft and silky, but they can be a little thin and feel a little cheap. They aren't perfect but they are anything but poor quality! If you wash them and style them the way you want, I'm sure it'll be perfect for your costume! Some of the costumes themselves aren't bad. I've certainly seen better. They're cheap, typical, basic Halloween costumes, just like the ones you see at Party City. I would definitely recommend Amazon or another store for an outfit, unless you're looking for steampunk, Victorian, or accessorized outfits. The corsets, goggles, petticoats, victorian dresses, hats, and tights are all great quality.

SFX items are cheap but effective. They get the job done but you can most definitely choose from another store and be well or maybe better off. The props aren't bad either. They aren't exactly realistic but they still work really well for decoration. The costume masks are very pretty, and look well made, good quality for a costume. Disguises also has the brand Demonias for platform shoes, they are great quality and are in top condition. The platforms are listed much cheaper than they are on the initial website. They have platform heels, shoes,

and boots. The bodysuits are a pretty cheap material but they still look nice and will be great for wearing them only a few times.

Disguises also sell colored contacts but I absolutely do not recommend buying them. You should only buy contacts from trusted companies that specialize in contacts or similar eye products to avoid any injury or damage. Using cheap contacts could tear your cornea or permanently damage your eyes. So please avoid using contacts from unknown sources. The face masks are decorative and look great. They would make breathing more difficult, but they do look great. Some even glow in the dark. Disguises also has other glow in the dark props, such as hats and a few shirts. They glow well and are relatively bright. The glow in the dark props aren't neon, but they do show up really well. These are perfect if you plan on trick or treating later on into the night!

Overall, the decorations look great, but there are a few cons. The stock is currently limited due to COVID-19 so finding decorations may be a bit difficult. Some of the costumes are cheaper material so they're better for wearing once, but they are not bad quality. Disguises is most definitely a store worth visiting more than once. The decorations and costumes make it a fun place to be and I highly advise visiting around Halloween time. Be careful with any contacts, enjoy your costumes, and have

fun with special effects. I encourage you to at least take a visit, as simply looking

around is just as fun as getting the costumes

Apple Cinnamon

Mug Cake



Prep time: 2 minutes

Cook time: 3 minutes

Total time: 5 minutes

Instructions

1. Mix together flour, baking powder, cinnamon, apple, and sugar in a mug.
2. Mix in one tablespoon butter, milk, and egg.
3. Combine another tablespoon of butter, and brown sugar in a separate bowl.
4. Reserve one tablespoon for topping. Mix the rest into the mug mixture.
5. Top with remaining topping. Microwave for 3 minutes

Pepperoni Pizza Pumpkins



Prep Time - 15 minute

Cook Time - 20 minute

AMOUNT	INGREDIENTS
1 can	Refrigerated Pizza crust
2 tablespoons (depends on serving)	Marinara sauce
16 slices (small)	Pepperoni
8	Mini mozzarella balls
1 egg	Slightly beaten with 2 teaspoons of water

1. Preheat the oven to 400°F, line a baking sheet with parchment paper and set aside.
2. Roll out pizza dough and using a 3 ½ or 4-inches cutter cut out 8 circles of dough.
3. Place a small dollop of marinara sauce in the center of each circle, add 2 pepperoni slices and a cube or a ball of mozzarella.
4. Bring the edges up and over, pressing them together and being sure to leave no gaps for the filling to leak out. Lay the pizza bombs on the prepared baking sheet.
5. Wrap each dough ball in a long piece of kitchen twine, around the ball to divide it into eight sections. The rolls are baked with the string attached and the dough rises around the string forming little pumpkin shapes.

6. Brush each ball with egg wash and bake 15-20 minutes, or until it rises and gets a nice golden-brown color.
7. Allow rolls to cool for a few minutes, then remove

the twine. Serve warm with marinara sauce alongside.

Sweet Potato Marshmallow

Recipe

Yields: 8 Servings	Prep Time: 0 Hours 20 Min	Total Time: 1 Hours 0 Min
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Ingredients:

Sweet potatoes

- **Cooking spray**
- **4 c. large sweet potatoes, peeled and cubed**
- **½ c. packed brown sugar**
- **8 tbsp melted butter**
- **1 tsp pure vanilla extract**
- **½ c. milk**
- **2 large eggs**
- **½ tsp kosher salt**

Streusel topping

- **1 c. packed dark brown sugar**
- **½ c. all purpose flour**
- **4 tbsp melted butter**
- **1 c. chopped pecans**
- **2 ½ c. mini marshmallows**

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 and grease a 9-x-13" baking dish with cooking spray. Place sweet potatoes in a large pot and cover with water. Bring to a boil then reduce heat and simmer until sweet potatoes are tender, about 15 minutes. Drain and let cool slightly then transfer to a large bowl.**
- 2. In a large bowl, stir together sweet potatoes, sugar, butter, vanilla and salt until smooth, pour into the prepared dish.**

3. ***In a medium bowl, stir together sugar, flour, and butter until it clumps. Stir in pecans then spread evenly over potatoes. Top with marshmallows***
4. ***Bake until cooked through and golden, about 30 minutes.***

Turkey cupcakes



INGREDIENTS

1 box chocolate cake mix, plus ingredients called for on box
1 1/3 c. (2 sticks and 5 1/3 tbsp.) butter, softened
5 1/3 c. powdered sugar
2/3 c. unsweetened cocoa powder
1 tsp. pure vanilla extract
4 tbsp. heavy cream
Pinch kosher salt
Pretzels, for decorating
Candy corn, for decorating
M&Ms, for decorating
Candy eyes, for decorating

DIRECTIONS

Line muffin tins with black cupcake liners. Prepare cupcake batter according to package directions.

Scoop cupcake batter into liners and bake until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Let cool completely.

In a large bowl using a hand mixer (or the bowl of a stand mixer using the paddle attachment), beat butter until fluffy. Add powdered sugar and cocoa powder and beat until combined, then add vanilla, heavy cream, and salt and beat until combined. (If you desire a thinner consistency, add 1 more tablespoon cream.)

Fill a pastry bag fitted with a 1/2" round tip with frosting. Frost cupcakes, making 1

larger frosting dollop for the body and 1 smaller one on top for the face.

Place 2 pretzels on the backside of the cupcake for the tail then arrange 4 candy corn pieces in front of them to finish the tail. Place another candy corn on the smaller dollop for the

beak and 3 brown M&Ms on each side for the wings.

Finish the turkey cupcake by placing 2 candy eyes above the beak.
