When Pentecost Day arrived, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound from heaven like the howling of a fierce wind filled the entire house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be individual flames of fire alighting on each one of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages as the Spirit enabled them to speak.

There were pious Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. When they heard this sound, a crowd gathered. They were mystified because everyone heard them speaking in their native languages. They were surprised and amazed, saying, "Look, aren't all the people who are speaking Galileans, every one of them? How then can each of us hear them speaking in our native language? Parthians, Medes, and Elamites; as well as residents of Mesopotamia, Judea, and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the regions of Libya bordering Cyrene; and visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism), Cretans and Arabs—we hear them declaring the mighty works of God in our own languages!" They were all surprised and bewildered. Some asked each other, "What does this mean?" Others jeered at them, saying, "They're full of new wine!"

Peter stood with the other eleven apostles. He raised his voice and declared, "Judeans and everyone living in Jerusalem! Know this! Listen carefully to my words! 15 These people aren't drunk, as you suspect; after all, it's only nine o'clock in the morning! 16 Rather, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy. Your young will see visions. Your elders will dream dreams. Even upon my servants, men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy. I will cause wonders to occur in the heavens above and signs on the earth below, blood and fire and a cloud of smoke. 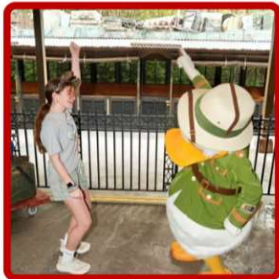


WELCOME TO TRINITY'S 2026 CONFIRMATION CLASS

We will meet in the Narthex following Children's Time in worship and then make our way upstairs to the movement and Sunday School rooms.

MUSIC NOTES

The prelude: We Now Implore the Holy Ghost is a chorale prelude by Dietrich Buxtehude (1637-1707). *Music in the public domain.*

The anthem: Veni Sancte Spiritus is the the fourth movement of Lauridsen's Lux Aeterna. It is composed in an arch form (ABCBA)—a form also traced back to the Medieval and Renaissance periods—and uses text dating back to the late 12th century. Lauridsen (b.1943) describes this movement as “exuberant, outgoing and joyous”. Veni Sancte Spiritus, sometimes called the Golden Sequence, is prescribed in the Roman Liturgy for the Masses of Pentecost. Although the poem's authorship is unknown, Archbishop Trench (1864) wrote that it is the “loveliest of all the sacred Latin hymns...it could only have been composed by one who had been acquainted with many sorrows and also with many consolations.”

The anthem before the sermon is composed by Thomas Tallis (c. 1505-1585). It is a very early example of the Anglican anthem (the word ‘anthem’ had been coined two or three centuries earlier as an English version of the Latin ‘antiphona’). It survived the Marian reaction and came back into use in Elizabeth's reign. The anthem very early acquired formal and stylistic mannerisms, notably a preference for four-part writing and syllabic declamation, a tendency to alternate homophonic episodes with passages of simple imitation, and the habit of sectional repetition, particularly of the final section. Listen for the repeated phrases: for example, “e'en the spirit of truth”. *Notes by Nick Sandon. Music in the Public Domain.*

The offertory anthem O Come Thou Sweet Redeeming Fire is composed for unaccompanied voices by Daniel Gawthrop (b. 1949), radio broadcaster, clinician, church musician, conductor, teacher and writer. Mr. Gawthrop has been the recipient of over 100 commissions to write original music, with works premiered at Washington National Cathedral, the Salt Lake City Mormon Tabernacle as well as the Concert Hall at Kennedy Center.
