Kirsten Johnson, graduated from William & Mary this May. She will return to William & Mary in the fall to complete her masters program in Public Policy.



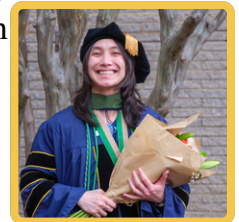

Children's Worship runs concurrently with "big" worship. Our Children's Worship is tailored to meet the needs of our young Christians ages 3 through 3rd grade; those who have outgrown nursery, but aren't quite ready to stay in the Sanctuary for the full service. We will meet in the Narthex following Children's Time in worship and then make our way upstairs to the Sunday School rooms.

MUSIC NOTES

The prelude: Edward Elgar had an unusual relationship with America. Although he never lived there, his music was greatly admired. The Pomp and Circumstance March No. 1 in D caught the attention of the Crown Prince Edward, soon to be Edward VII, when it received a double encore in concert in 1901. Prince Edward requested that the middle section be made into a song for his upcoming coronation that year, so Elgar engaged the poet A.C. Benson to set words to the famous tune, and ‘*Land of Hope and Glory*’ was born. The lyrics are never used in The States; the American tradition began when Elgar was awarded an honorary doctorate in Music from Yale University, at which only the orchestral version was played. The 1905 Yale graduation ceremony was full of music, but it was the ‘Trio’ from Pomp and Circumstance March No. 1 in D which was the greatest hit, and in later years other universities followed suit, starting with Princeton in 1907, Chicago in 1908 and Columbia in 1913. *Notes by Victoria Longdon Music in the public domain*

The anthem is an aria and chorus from Felix Mendelssohn’s 1846 oratorio, *Elijah*, Op. 70. It is preceded by two recitatives: *Arise, Elijah* and *O Lord, I have labored in vain*. An angel summons Elijah to arise and journey 40 days to Mount Horeb, where the Lord will reveal himself. In the emotional climax of the oratorio, Elijah cries out that all of his efforts have been in vain. He has failed to make the people of Israel accept God. Elijah’s faith falters, as he asks God why He created His own adversaries and hardened their hearts against Him. The angel returns to comfort Elijah, telling him again and again in a beautiful aria, “O rest in the Lord,” to wait for God and not be concerned with evildoers. The final time, the soloist lingers on the word “wait,” thus symbolically indicating that Elijah’s one remaining task is his hardest: to be patient. The chorus sings a chorale stating the lesson Elijah must learn: “He that shall endure to the end shall be saved.” *Notes by Sanford Dole. Music in the public domain.*

The offertory anthem was composed by Johann Pachelbel (1653-1706). While perhaps best known for his *Canon in D*, a favorite at weddings, Pachelbel was a noted teacher and organist as well as composer. One of his pupils was Johann Christoph Bach, Johann Sebastian’s older brother. Pachelbel’s influence most certainly was passed on to the younger Bach, when he came to live with his older brother after their parents’ death. In today’s anthem, Pachelbel gives the soaring chorale tune in long notes to the sopranos, while the rest of the choir accompanies in shorter value notes, “multiplying the appearances of the single motif”—a technique often found in J.S. Bach’s choral writing. *Music in the public domain.*

The postlude is a chorale prelude: a short liturgical composition for organ using a chorale tune in long notes. J.G. Walther (1684-1748) has set Joachim Neander’s hymntune *Lobe den Herren* with the *cantus firmus* (fixed melody) in the pedals. Chorale preludes were used to introduce and set a pitch for congregational singing of a hymn. *Music in the public domain.*
