*GOSPEL LESSON

[Matthew 15:10-28](#)

¹⁰ Then he called the crowd to him and said to them, "Listen and understand: ¹¹ it is not what goes into the mouth that defiles a person, but it is what comes out of the mouth that defiles." ¹² Then the disciples approached and said to him, "Do you know that the Pharisees took offense when they heard what you said?" ¹³ He answered, "Every plant that my heavenly Father has not planted will be uprooted. ¹⁴ Let them alone; they are blind guides of the blind. And if one blind person guides another, both will fall into a pit." ¹⁵ But Peter said to him, "Explain this parable to us." ¹⁶ Then he said, "Are you also still without understanding? ¹⁷ Do you not see that whatever goes into the mouth enters the stomach, and goes out into the sewer? ¹⁸ But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and this is what defiles. ¹⁹ For out of the heart come evil intentions, murder, adultery, fornication, theft, false witness, slander. ²⁰ These are what defile a person, but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile." ²¹ Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. ²² Just then a Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon." ²³ But he did not answer her at all. And his disciples came and urged him, saying, "Send her away, for she keeps shouting after us." ²⁴ He answered, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. ²⁵ But she came and knelt before him, saying, 'Lord, help me.' ²⁶ He answered, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs.' ²⁷ She said, 'Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table.' ²⁸ Then Jesus answered her, 'Woman, great is your faith! Let it be done for you as you wish.'" And her daughter was healed instantly."

SUNDAY MORNING AT TRINITY CHURCH

The flowers on the altar are given to the glory of God and in celebration of Ronnie Willett's 30 years of service and dedication to Trinity.

Today's Prelude: "Den Bortkomne Sauen (The Lost Sheep)" is a Norwegian folk song based on Jesus' parable of the lost sheep. It sets the general mood for a service devoted to "Lost Sheep" and helps prepare for reflections on the "lost"—either those who have strayed or those who are simply the "other" (not the "chosen ones"). The adaptation sung today is based on a recording by Annbjørg Lien for Hardanger fiddle and organ. The folk song text is treated quite freely, both to preserve the rhymed couplets of the original and to condense the original five-verse song into three verses. Some in the congregation may recognize the melody as the opening theme of the movie Fargo.

Today's Solo: "She Came to Jesus" is based on one of today's readings, Matthew 15:21-28, which tells the story of the Canaanite woman whose great faith persuaded Jesus to heal her daughter, even though he initially told her, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel"—in other words, that she was outside the fold. The beautiful text, by Carolyn Winfrey Gillette, was originally set to the hymn tune "Be Thou My Vision." In the adaptation sung today, the text is set to the music of Ralph Vaughan Williams's song "The Call" from Five Mystical Songs (1911).



TRINITY CHURCH'S WEEKLY NEWS

Tithes and offerings may be sent to Trinity via normal mail (checks only) or via the online donation portal on [Trinity's website](#). (click on "[♥ Giving](#)" in the top right corner). You may make online donations directly from your checking account with no check required to be mailed. This will help us immensely as our office will have limited hours to receive and process the checks. However, you may still give by mailing a check - whatever donation you want to provide will be very welcome.

We also have the capability to give by text. Just send a text that says "Give" to: 703-783-3034.

If you want more information on giving by texting works read on:

Step 1. Text the word "Give" - to 703-783-3034. Don't worry - nothing will be charged to you until you enter your credit card or bank information.

Step 2. You will receive a text back to you saying, "It looks like you are a new giver ; to begin (a link to the text giving site will appear), click on it.

Step 3: A form will appear that will clearly say "Trinity United Methodist Church" at the top left. It will ask you to fill in the following information:

1. Amount you want to give and the fund you want to give to. If you want to give a general offering, you don't need to write anything! If you want to give to a specific fund, you can use one of the following funds: Lent; Flowers; Music; Pastor (For Pastor's Helping Fund)
2. How you want to give - credit card or direct deposit from your bank (called ACH bank transfer)
3. If you select credit card, it will ask for your name, address, email address and credit card information.
4. If you select ACH - it will ask for you name, address, email address and bank routing and bank account information
5. At the bottom you can select one time gift or a recurring period. Suggest you select one time gift for the first time.
6. That is it. Then click on Donate Now!

If you made a mistake or change your mind - no worries just send the word "refund" to the same number the last amount you sent them will be refunded to you! Also you can send the word "commands" that will give you a list of options on how to change your account or update your giving amounts.
