GOSPEL LESSON

Mark 9:14-29

¹⁴ When they came to the disciples, they saw a great crowd around them, and some scribes arguing with them. ¹⁵ When the whole crowd saw him, they were immediately overcome with awe, and they ran forward to greet him. ¹⁶ He asked them, "What are you arguing about with them?" ¹⁷ Someone from the crowd answered him, "Teacher, I brought you my son; he has a spirit that makes him unable to speak; ¹⁸ and whenever it seizes him, it dashes him down; and he foams and grinds his teeth and becomes rigid; and I asked your disciples to cast it out, but they could not do so." ¹⁹ He answered them, "You faithless generation, how much longer must I be among you? How much longer must I put up with you? Bring him to me." ²⁰ And they brought the boy to him. When the spirit saw him, immediately it convulsed the boy and he fell on the ground and rolled about, foaming at the mouth. ²¹ Jesus asked the father, "How long has this been happening to him?" And he said, "From childhood. ²² It has often cast him into the fire and into the water, to destroy him; but if you are able to do anything, have pity on us and help us." ²³ Jesus said to him, "If you are able!—All things can be done for the one who believes." ²⁴ **Immediately the father of the child cried out, "I believe; help my unbelief!"** ²⁵ When Jesus saw that a crowd came running together, he rebuked the unclean spirit, saying to it, "You spirit that keeps this boy from speaking and hearing, I command you, come out of him, and never enter him again!" ²⁶ After crying out and convulsing him terribly, it came out, and the boy was like a corpse, so that most of them said, "He is dead." ²⁷ But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him up, and he was able to stand. ²⁸ When he had entered the house, his disciples asked him privately, "Why could we not cast it out?" ²⁹ He said to them, "This kind can come out only through prayer."

Lead, Kindly Light is a setting of the poem “The Pillar of the Cloud,” written in 1833 by John Henry Newman (later Cardinal). The poem is the prayer of one who has returned to God after straying for a while. Where once he went his own way and pride ruled his will, he now puts his trust in God to lead him safely through encircling gloom and dark of night to a bright morn. The message for us is that we, too, can trust God to show us the way, especially in difficult or uncertain times. The music is an adaptation of Mack Wilberg’s arrangement of a hymn by John B. Dykes.

You Do Not Walk Alone is an adaptation of Elaine Hagenburg’s beautiful composition, originally for full choir and piano. The Irish text offers solace in dark times and assurance that, when shadows fall, we do not walk alone.

Wednesday Bible Study via ZOOM: Join us on Wednesday evenings via [Zoom](#) for the next 6 weeks to discuss Paul's letter to the Romans. We will meet from 7:00 to 8:00 PM to study the book of Romans and to reflect on the history of Christianity. Many essential Christian doctrines are grounded in this letter and there are recurring themes of the divine-human relationship. One thing Romans provides for us is a sense of hope. If you plan on joining us, please take a moment to look over the first 3 chapters of Romans prior to Wednesday evening. As you are reading the scriptures, imagine hearing Paul, a Jew, as he is speaking to the Gentiles (remember this was usually referring to all people who were not Jewish). Then ask yourself a question: When we consider to whom Paul is speaking, how does this affect the way we interpret his words? Tithes and offerings may be sent to Trinity via normal mail (checks only) or via the online donation portal on [Trinity's website](#). (click on "[♥ Giving](#)" in the top right corner). You may make online donations directly from your checking account with no check required to be mailed. This will help us immensely as our office will have limited hours to receive and process the checks. However, you may still give by mailing a check - whatever donation you want to provide will be very welcome.

We also have the capability to give by text. Just send a text that says "Give" to: 703-783-3034.

If you want more information on giving by texting works read on:

Step 1. Text the word "Give" - to 703-783-3034. Don't worry - nothing will be charged to you until you enter your credit card or bank information.

Step 2. You will receive a text back to you saying, "It looks like you are a new giver ; to begin (a link to the text giving site will appear), click on it.

Step 3: A form will appear that will clearly say "Trinity United Methodist Church" at the top left. It will ask you to fill in the following information:

- 1.Amount you want to give and the fund you want to give to. If you want to give a general offering, you don't need to write anything! If you want to give to a specific fund, you can use one of the following funds: Lent; Flowers; Music; Pastor (For Pastor's Helping Fund)
- 2.How you want to give - credit card or direct deposit from your bank (called ACH bank transfer)
- 3.If you select credit card, it will ask for your name, address, email address and credit card information.
- 4.If you select ACH - it will ask for you name, address, email address and bank routing and bank account information
- 5.At the bottom you can select one time gift or a recurring period. Suggest you select one time gift for the first time.
- 6.That is it. Then click on Donate Now!

If you made a mistake or change your mind - no worries just send the word "refund" to the same number the last amount you sent them will be refunded to you! Also you can send the word "commands" that will give you a list of options on how to change your account or update your giving amounts.
