Safety First!

During the school day, we always seek to keep your children safe. Two of the most stressful times for us (and sometimes families) are arrival and dismissal. We want to make sure that students get to their classrooms safely and get home safely. We encourage all of our students to take the bus, the safest and most secure way to get to and from school, or when possible, to walk or ride their bike to and from school. However, we realize that many of our students are transported to and from school by a trusted adult. Therefore, we have set up procedures to ensure the safe arrival and dismissal of Denver students. Sometimes we will have the assistance of a Wilmington resource officer to help us at arrival and dismissal. As we begin the year, there are little to no changes in the arrival and dismissal procedures. See below for some reminders about how it works.

Arrival

- Students arriving to school in cars should **ONLY** be dropped off along the curb and should **NOT** be running between parked cars to get to the curb. This will be **STRICTLY** enforced this year in order to increase student safety, especially along Lorish Avenue.
- Students should not arrive to school earlier than 8:45. There is **NO SUPERVISION** for students who are dropped off earlier than 8:45. **Students who arrive prior to 9:00, should go to the playground to await admittance in the building. There will be adult supervision on the playground between 8:45-9:00 each morning.**
- At 8:45, students eating breakfast are able to come in the front doors or back doors and go directly to the cafeteria.
- At 9:00, all doors are opened for all students to enter. Students should report directly to their homeroom for attendance, in order to not receive a tardy.
- Tardy slips are given to **ALL** students who are not in their homeroom by 9:15. Tardy slips are distributed to students in the office. **Remember:** Every 5 tardies = 1 day absence.



Dismissal

- Bus riders will be dismissed out the front doors at 3:45 pm.
- Students who are being picked up will be dismissed out the back doors onto the playground at 3:45 pm following bus riders.
- Students will not be dismissed from the playground until teachers see the person picking up each student, therefore, authorized adults must enter the playground to pick up their Denver student.
- Students who walk to school or ride their bike to school should report to the gym after school. A teacher will dismiss each student/group of students when the whole group walking together has gathered together.
- **All changes in dismissal procedures should be communicated to Mrs. Dallas in the office via a phone call each day by 3:00.**

Positive Behavior Support System PBS

At Denver, we encourage positive behaviors by clearly stating expectations and recognizing students who meet those expectations. Basically, all of our expectations follow under the following set of guidelines -

1. Denver Place students act respectfully.
2. Denver Place students act responsibly.
3. Denver Place students act safely.
4. Denver Place students are kind.

We frequently review what it looks like to act in these three ways in the following locations within the school environment - classroom, cafeteria, restrooms, hallways, dismissal, arrival, and playground. We review these expectations often - at least once every quarter.
