Who We Are: SPARCC's mission is to stop domestic and sexual violence in our communities. SPARCC is the only state-certified center for domestic violence and sexual assault services in Sarasota and Desoto Counties. All of SPARCC's services are free and confidential.

Who SPARCC serves: We serve families, women and men who are in eminent danger from domestic violence or sexual assault and needs a safe place to live. In addition to serving survivors, SPARCC actively engages in promoting social change and prevention through community awareness and education programs.

When is SPARCC open: SPARCC's Emergency Shelter is open 24 hours a day, year round. Our Sarasota Outreach office is open Monday through Friday, 8:30 AM to 5:00 PM, and our Outreach offices in Arcadia, Venice and North Port are by appointment only.

How long is an average stay: A mother and her children, a single women, a father and his children or a single man's stay can range from one night or up to 6 weeks. Extensions after 6 weeks are available on an as needed basis and can sometime range up to several months. The length of stay is determined by the level of services needed, or in some cases, providing a safe place until the perpetrator is served with a Restraining Order or arrested.
