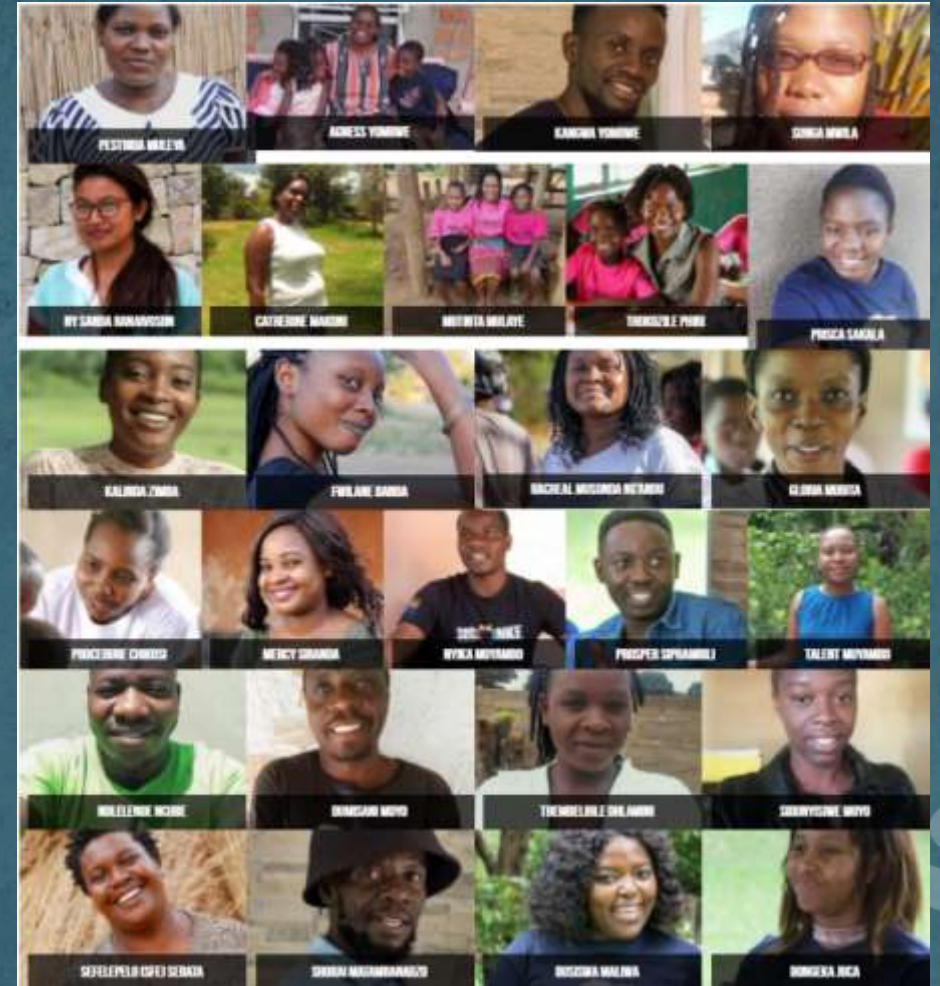

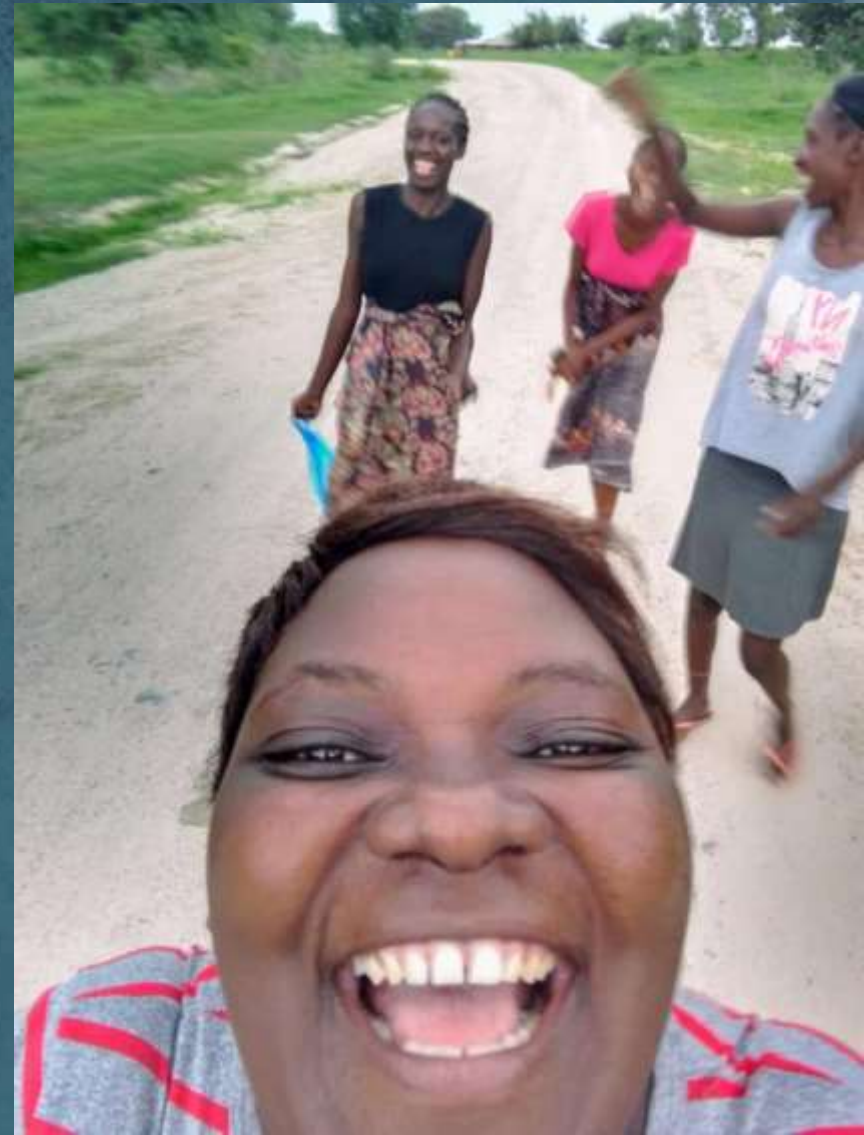

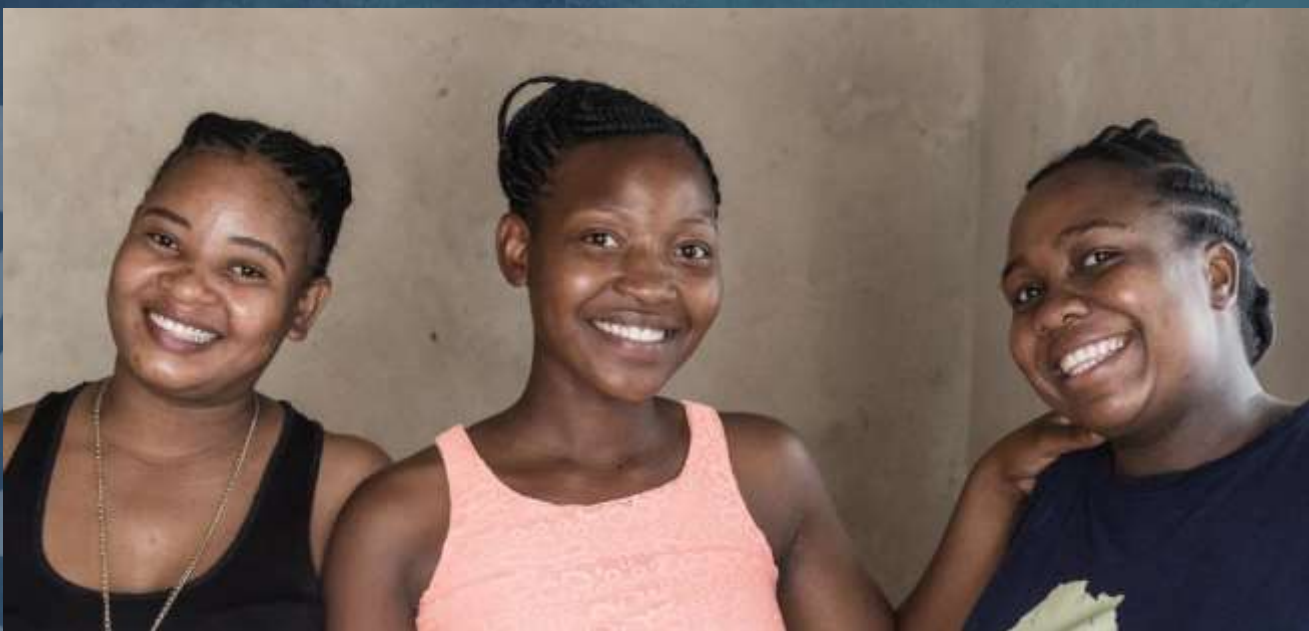

They work to reduce patriarchal barriers that impede gender equity and enable gender-based violence. They advocate against substance abuse and for education and decent, hard work.

- Includes 3 girls clubs and now 1 boys club... with plans for more!



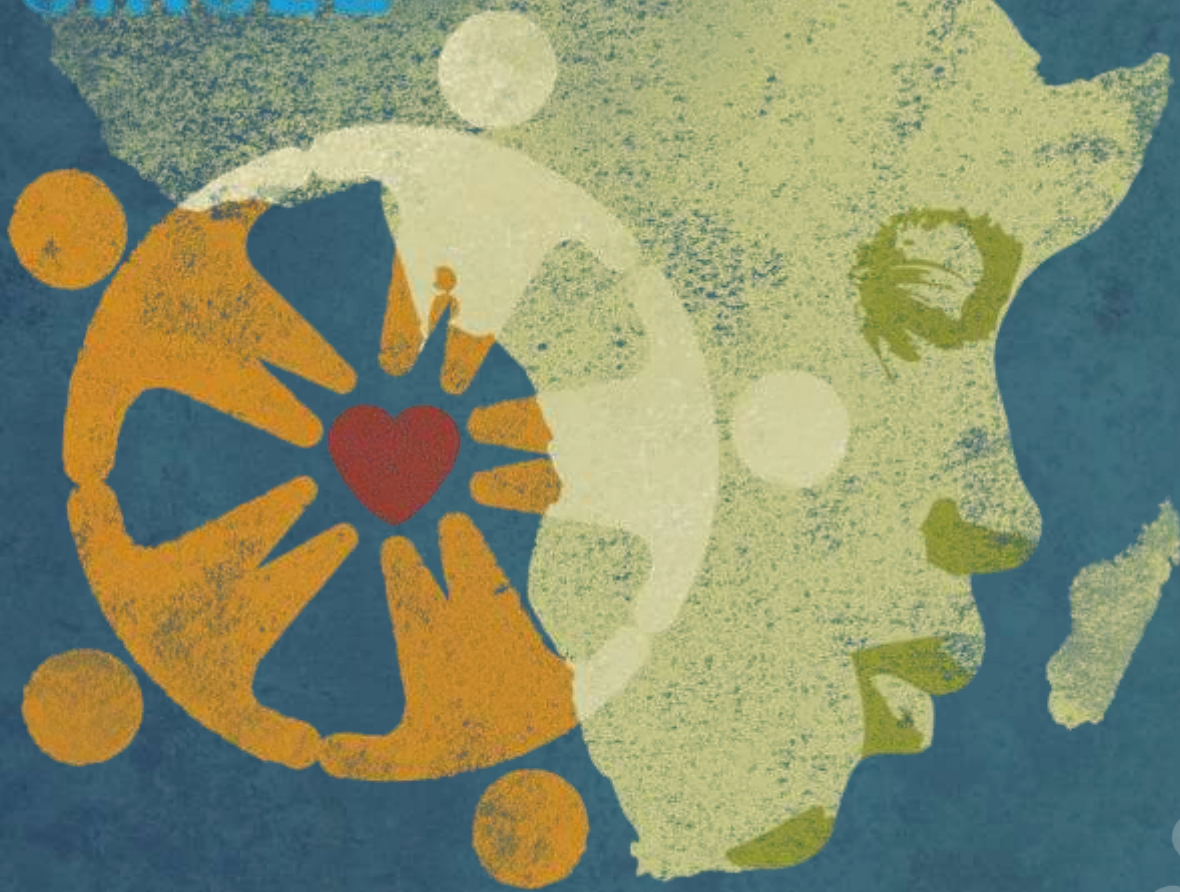

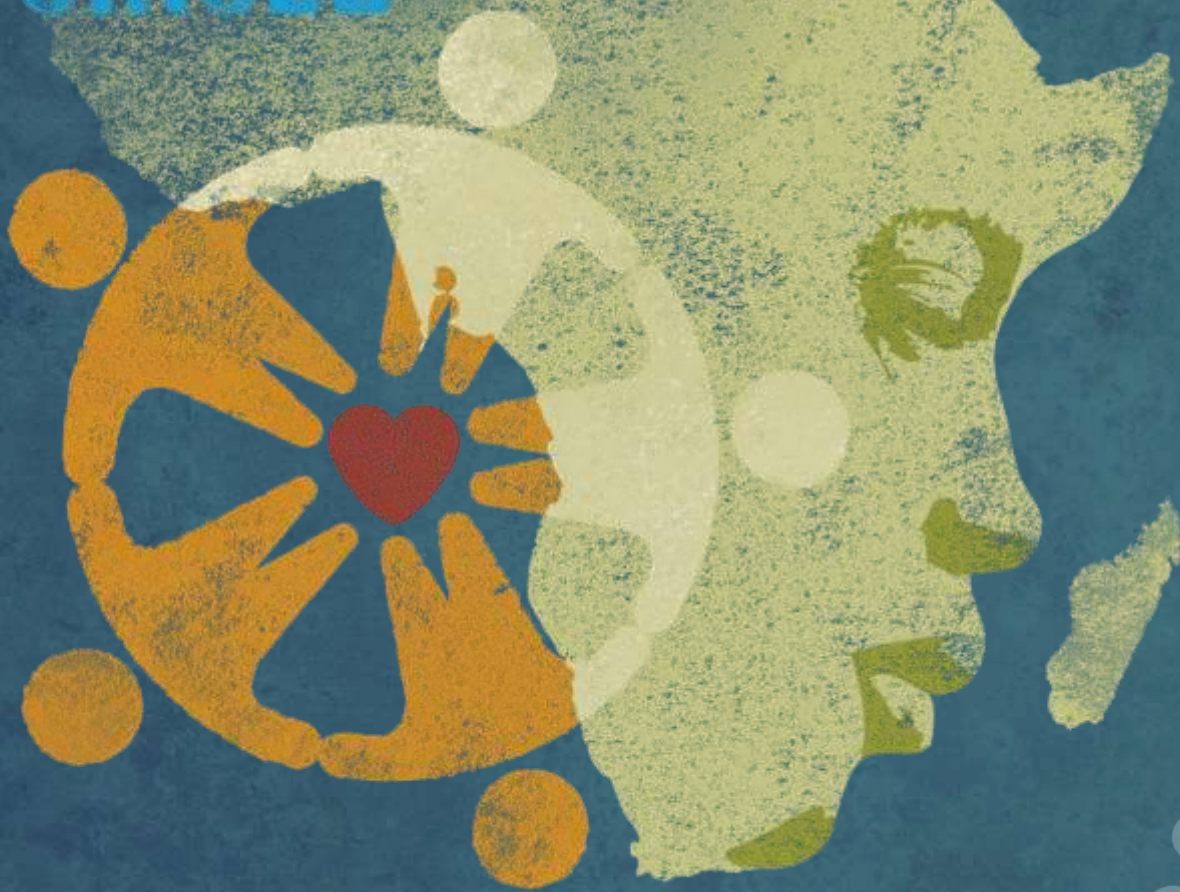

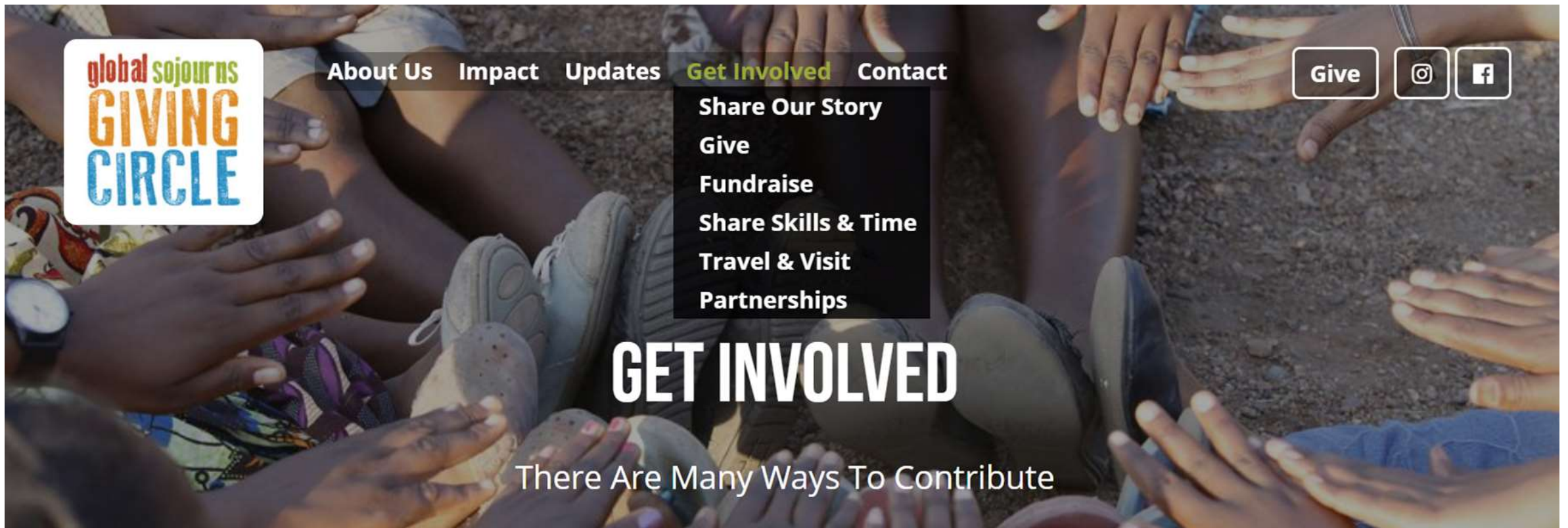
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
