### PASTORS MESSAGE

### **FAITH THAT WELCOMES ALL**

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" Luke 17: 5

The disciples cry out to Jesus, "Increase our faith!" They long for something bigger, stronger, more impressive. But Jesus reminds them that faith is not about size, it's about trust. Even faith as small as a mustard seed can do great things because it connects us to God's power, not our own.



World Communion Sunday, celebrated each October, opens Christ's table to everyone in the body of Christ. On this day, people from every culture, language, and tradition gather around Christ's table as the body of Christ. Some will share bread baked from wheat, others from rice, corn cassava, or yams. The cup will hold grape juice, wine, or other local fruits. The table looks different in each place, but the invitation is the same: all are welcome.

The disciples wanted greater faith. Jesus showed them that the faith they already had was enough. The same is true for us. We do not need perfect belief or flawless discipleship to come to the Lord's table. We come as we are, with mustard seed faith, and Christ meets us there.

World Communion Sunday reminds us that this table is not ours to guard. It is Christ's table. It's open not only to people who look like us, or live where we live or believe like we believe—it is open to all who are hungry. At this table, the barriers that divide us such as race, nationality, language, denomination, conservative or progressive beliefs fall away. What remains is Christ's love, wide enough to embrace the whole world.



May we have faith that everyone who gathers at Christ's table is meant to be there and by welcoming them, we are doing nothing more than what Jesus commands by loving our neighbor.

And so it continued that week, a mystery to figure out each day And somehow we managed to make something good (or so they say) All we knew was that those people didn't go hungry Nope, not on our watch, we couldn't let that happen! (sorry....no rhyme for hungry!)

Shoeboxes will be available October 19th in fellowship hall with instructions. Shoeboxes are due back no later than November 16th.





### ONA TEAM UPDATE

Open and Affirming (ONA) Covenant - Why do we need one?

We declare ourselves to be open to and affirming of all people when we recognize our unity in diversity. So how do we let others know that? In the UCC church, we do so by affirming an Open and Affirming (ONA) Covenant.

Open and Affirming Covenant: Described in Three Parts

A covenant is defined as an act of faith, a solemn promise to God in response to God's Holy Word. An Open and Affirming Covenant is a promise that a congregation takes seriously St. Paul's admonition to "accept one another, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God." (Romans 15:7, NIV). It is a solemn step for a UCC congregation in its life of faith, one that can lead a congregation to grow and flourish. It is more than a statement, policy, or declaration. An ONA Covenant affirms an explicit WELCOME and AFFIRMATION of INCLUSION to all people listed in the Covenant, into the full life, ministry, and sacraments of the church. All sacraments and rites of an ONA congregation are available to those persons or groups spelled out in the Covenant including baptism, confirmation, communion, and marriage as well as employment.

Our DRAFT Open and Affirming Covenant at St. Andrew's has three parts: 1) Diversities we strive to embrace, 2) Acknowledgement and repentance for the exclusion we have participated in as members of the Christian Church, and 3) Promise of safety and inclusion to all those that have been marginalized.

In the first part of the DRAFT Open and Affirming Covenant, we define the goal and who is affected, the desire to be inclusive to marginalized people:

"St. Andrew's United Church of Christ is an inclusive community rooted in God's incredible love. As an Open and Affirming Church, we strive to embrace and seek to preserve the beautiful diversity of God's creation. We are a Christian community of faith who welcomes all people, embracing the diversities of sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, race, ethnic background, immigration status, refugee status, socio-economic status, age, physical or mental ability, addiction/recovery challenges, family structure, relationship status, political affiliation, soul injury, faith backgrounds, doubters, questioners, and welcoming anyone who has been excluded in the past. All are invited to participate fully in the life of the church-in worship, celebrating the sacraments, in fellowship, ministering as lay and ordained persons, in leadership positions and in mission.

In the second part of the DRAFT Open and Affirming Covenant, we define the problem: exclusion. We acknowledge and repent of the exclusion we have participated in as members of the Christian Church. This could involve actions we've taken, things we've witnessed but did not address, or exclusion we were unaware of.

"We recognize that the Christian Church has historically excluded those who have not fit its preconceived ideas of who is acceptable to God. We acknowledge our silence has contributed to pain and exclusion. We repent and seek to live out God's love, justice and compassion as Jesus taught. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." This is the first commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and Prophets hang on these two commandments. Matthew 22:37-40"

The third part of the DRAFT Open and Affirming Covenant is the promise to do better now that we know better.

We covenant to be a place of inclusion and affirmation that is safe for all people and to meet you where you are on life's journey to share God's love with you. We offer ourselves and our resources to ensure inclusion and justice for all people and offer a place for healing, understanding, hope and love to be manifested. Honoring the diversity of God's children, we make this commitment with the help and grace of God.

I hope that one day we will have an affirmed Open and Affirming Covenant at St. Andrew's so we can enjoy all the diverse gifts that God has as part of Creation. An affirmed ONA Covenant explicitly promises that these groups are not just welcomed but celebrated. It communicates our open and affirming commitment to those visiting our church website, visiting services on-line or services in person that they will be considered a wonderfully and fearfully made Child of God. It will be displayed prominently on our church website and will allow St. Andrew's to be included on an ONA church list on the UCC website where people go to find churches. What is the impact of being an Open and Affirming UCC congregation? To have an Open and Affirming Covenant? More next month on this . . . .


