FAITH FORMATION SUNDAY SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 13 AT 8:45 AND 10:15AM

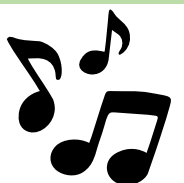

PASTORS MESSAGE

"Swarms of living creatures will live wherever the river flows. There will be large numbers of fish, because this water flows there and makes the salt water fresh; so where the river flows everything will live. [...] Fruit trees of all kinds will grow on both banks of the river. Their leaves will not wither, nor will their fruit fail. Every month they will bear fruit, because the water from the sanctuary flows to them. Their fruit will serve for food and their leaves for healing."
(Ezek 47:9,12)

In August, I had an unexpected trip to South Dakota, to be with my dear friend whose husband tragically passed away. I had the honor of participating in his funeral. I don't often get to places in the western part of our nation so I forget just how different and how beautiful the landscape is there. There is open land as far as you can see with beautiful buttes sticking up here and there. The sky is huge and the clouds are magnificent. We were near Spearfish Canyon and were lucky enough to take a couple of hikes. The Canyon was green and lush with Spearfish Creek (picture) and cooler. If you follow me on Facebook, you know I took way too many pictures but I couldn't help myself. I was in awe.



My vacation was spent in the mountains. It's my favorite place to go. It's also green and lush and the Poconos are dotted with lakes, streams, and waterfalls (picture of Shohola Falls). I take so many pictures because it's just beautiful. You, too may have taken a vacation and gone to the shore, or camping, or maybe you've even traveled somewhere far away. The landscape of each place is unique to see and experience.



There is a little known liturgical season that is becoming more recognized in the UCC and other denominations that is called the Season of Creation. It begins on September 1 and ends on the first Sunday in October. It is a special season where we celebrate God as Creator, and acknowledge Creation as the divine work that calls us to be allies who love and care for the gift of all that is created.

This year's theme is "Living Water" and is based on Ezekiel 47:9, 12. These verses in Ezekiel are a powerful vision of hope and ecological healing. Set during exile and loss, Ezekiel's vision begins with a small trickle of living water flowing from the place of prayer and sacrifice. From a tiny stream, it grows into an unstoppable river. The river flows from the Temple, nourished by the worship and prayers of God's people. The river doesn't just sustain life, it restores entire ecosystems.

As droughts become more common—remember last year when the stream across the street from the church dried up—and severe storms that bring flooding and devastation to communities, it's becoming clearer just how important it is care for creation and to be responsible with how we use it's resources, especially our water sources that give life to everything around us.

The same holds true of our spiritual life. Ezekiel's vision uplifts that the living water comes from prayer and worship in the Temple. It's through prayer and worship of God our Creator, that we are filled with living water that gives life not only to us but then flows out into the world bringing healing and wholeness to our relationships with one another and with all of creation.

As we come back from our summer travels, may we take time to notice the living water in our own lives, the streams, rivers and ocean that took our breath away, and the ordinary tap water that kept us hydrated throughout the summer months. As the Season of Creation begins, I invite you to come home to worship, to gather again at the source of that living water that flows from prayer and praise of our Creator. Just as Ezekiel's trickle grew into a river that healed everything it touched, our worship together has a way of growing beyond our church, filling us up so that we can pour out care, healing and hope to all of creation.

AUGUST CONSISTORY REPORT

Our August Consistory meeting continued the deep and faithful work of discerning God's direction for St. Andrew's. As we continue to live into our vision of being Rooted in God's Inclusive Love, we spent time working on our strategic plan, technology upgrades, by-law revisions, financial stewardship, family ministry, and outreach to our wider community.

We reviewed our current financial picture and are grateful that, through careful adjustments to our budget, we are currently on track to break even this year. While this is encouraging, we also recognize that sustaining and growing the ministries God has entrusted to us will require continued attention to stewardship and giving. We are deeply thankful for everyone who gives faithfully to St. Andrew's. Every gift—large or small—is an expression of faith and a way of helping our church continue to serve, welcome, and share God's love with our community. We encourage one another to prayerfully consider how we each might grow in our stewardship as we are able.

We are currently working on submitting a grant application to support safety and security improvements throughout our property. This grant does not require a matching contribution, and if awarded, it could provide funding for security cameras, new doors, and improvements to our building access systems. We will keep the congregation informed if we receive the grant and will share more about the scope and timeline of these projects at that time. We are grateful for the opportunity to explore ways to make our church building a safer and more welcoming space for all.

We continue to work with Altek toward the full installation and operation of our new screens and technology upgrades. We are hopeful that everything will be up and running by the middle of September, barring any unexpected technology hiccups! Thank you to the congregation for your continued patience, encouragement, and support throughout this project. We are also continuing to welcome contributions toward the cost of our screen and technology upgrades. If you are able and willing to help, your generosity is greatly appreciated.

Our By-Laws Subcommittee has begun the important work of reviewing our Constitution and By-Laws. This will be a longer-term project as we update our governing documents to reflect our transition from the Penn Southeast Conference of the UCC to the Keystone Conference of the UCC. We will also be taking this opportunity to modernize our Constitution and By-Laws so that they better reflect the needs, opportunities, and challenges of the church today. This work may not always be visible to the congregation, but it is important work that helps provide a strong foundation for our future ministry.

Through the Penridge Ministerium, St. Andrew's will participate in a special way of honoring our first responders as we approach the 25th anniversary of September 11, 2001. We will be putting together a snack basket filled with goodies featuring red packaging for the Perkasio Fire Department. If you would like to contribute snacks, please see the information elsewhere in this newsletter.

On September 11, the sanctuary will be open from 8:30–11:00 a.m. for a time of prayer, reflection, and remembrance. We will join churches around the nation in tolling our church bell six times—four times remembering the four plane crashes and twice remembering the collapse of the World Trade Center towers. We invite members of St. Andrew's and our wider community to spend some time that day in prayer and remembrance. May we remember those who lost their lives, those who responded with courage and compassion, and all whose lives were forever changed. May our remembrance also call us toward peace, compassion, and a world where we care for one another.

Our Inclusion Team will begin meeting this month as we continue the work of living out our Open and Affirming covenant—not simply as words we affirm, but as a commitment we seek to embody in the life and ministry of St. Andrew's. If you are interested in being part of this ongoing work, please reach out to Amanda Duffy. There is room for many voices and gifts as we continue learning how to welcome and include all people more fully.

Consistory also spent time focusing on family ministry and how we can create meaningful opportunities for children and families to connect with faith and with one another. We are excited about several new and growing opportunities!

Beginning in worship on September 13, we will introduce a Pray-Ground—a quiet play and sensory space within the sanctuary where young children can move, explore, and engage in age-appropriate activities while remaining with their families and connected to the worshiping community. Our hope is not simply to provide a place for children to be occupied, but to find new ways to help children experience worship as a place where they truly belong. We look forward to continuing to explore ways to include our youngest members more fully in worship and the life of our church.

We will also be transitioning away from our traditional 9:00 a.m. Sunday School format. This does not mean Christian education for our children is ending. Instead, we are seeking a new model that better meets the realities and schedules of today's families. Beginning this fall, we will offer a monthly VBS-style family gathering featuring Bible stories, crafts, mission projects, games, music, and dinner or snacks. These gatherings will give families an opportunity to learn, serve, worship, and have fun together in a welcoming environment. Dates will be announced soon, so stay tuned!

We are also exploring a new virtual Christian education option that will allow parents and families to access faith-formation materials when it works best for their schedules. We are excited to see how these new approaches can help St. Andrew's nurture faith beyond the traditional Sunday morning model. There is much happening at St. Andrew's, and we are grateful for the many people who continue to give their time, talents, prayers, and resources to help our church grow.

As we move into this next chapter, we are reminded that ministry is not about simply maintaining what has always been. It is about listening for where God is calling us, being willing to grow and adapt, and trusting that the Spirit is still at work among us. There are many new and budding ministries taking root at St. Andrew's. We look forward to nurturing those seeds together and watching, with faith and hope, where God will lead us next.

MISSION WEEK REFLECTION

He has showed you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

Micah 6:8

The week of June 22-27 was an exhilarating week with much fun, fellowship and breaking bread together. As we all know eating is a big part of St. Andrew's community life and each morning, we had a wonderful breakfast prepared by Barb Fritz along with a group helping her to prepare and serve our meal. Pastor Barb sent us out each day with devotions keeping us grounded to look around us, to see what is happening in our own community, to hear others and their needs, to show love and kindness to all.

I believe what impacted me the most was Upper Bucks Fostering Hope at St. Paul's UCC where fostering parents can come to get children's clothing and other supplies for newborn to 18 years of age. These fostering parents can receive a child at



anytime and there are volunteers they contact at Upper Bucks Fostering Hope to get supplies needed for the child. It does not matter what time of the day or night Fostering Hope is prepared to heed the call. They provide "Bags of Hope", an emergency kit for new fosters, "Dignity Duffel" bags for each foster child to use to keep clothing and items in instead of them using garbage bags as they move around from one home to another. There are also times parents and the child/children can come in to shop. This is where our Mission Team came into help with many bags of children's clothing sorting and hanging so that when a child was placed in a foster home or in need of clothing fostering parent and children could shop at the "Foster-Share Closet". It was a tiring but exhilarating day of learning how there is a place for foster parents and children to go for help.

There were many other missions I helped with during the week, like moving shelves for Ram Packs. Planting the gardens at FISH which was a HOT, but fun time as we beautified the area with flowers so the Clients waited could enjoy the beauty of God's creation as they waited; hopefully bringing some joy and smiles to their faces. Painting the classrooms downstairs to beautify our space for our VBS children and new possibilities for those rooms and last but not least helping get the Book Sale ready for the rummage sale. Vespers on Tuesday night had to come inside due to rains, but was a time to reflect on what we had done as well as what was ahead. Good food, good friends and good fellowship with the topping of getting to have Pastor Nick lead us in many songs. What a joy!!

The Mission Week in our own Community was a great way for us to see what is happening in our area, where there are needs and possibly how St. Andrew's can help with those needs in our own community. We were blessed with Fellowship and helping others through God's love. May we always know that God is with us and we are to share God's love by walking with others no matter what the circumstances and showing love and kindness to all.

Exploring the Bible Adult Circle



The Bible is one of the most controversial books ever written and it is considered sacred by the Christian Church. Many of us grew up reading and hearing the stories in the Bible while the Bible is relatively new to others. The Bible has drawn people to faith and turned others away. The Bible is the best-selling book according to the Guinness Book of World Records and it's also on banned book lists. What do we really know about the Bible?

What if worship was a place where children didn't just sit quietly—but were welcomed to wiggle, wonder, play, and pray? That's the heart behind our new Pray-Ground at St. Andrew's!

A Pray-Ground is a special, child-friendly space within the sanctuary where young children can engage with worship in ways that are meaningful and age-appropriate. Rather than separating children from the congregation, the Pray-Ground helps families worship together, reminding us that children are an important part of our church community.

At St. Andrew's, our Pray-Ground will be located in the front corner of the sanctuary and will provide a welcoming space for children, especially those up through about age 6 or 7. It will include quiet, hands-on activities such as blocks, sensory toys, coloring, books, and faith-based toys and materials. Children can explore, create, and play while still being part of the worshipping community.

The Pray-Ground isn't about keeping children perfectly quiet or still.

It's about making room for children to be children while they experience God's love and learn that they belong in the church. We hope it will help families feel more comfortable bringing their little ones to worship and help our entire congregation embrace the joyful sounds and energy children bring to our church.

For families who prefer or need a little more space, our nursery will remain open and available for families and children to use during worship. Families can choose the space that works best for their child and their needs that day. Whether a child is playing in the Pray-Ground, spending time in the nursery, or sitting with their family in the pew, there is a place for every child at St. Andrew's.

We're excited to create a space where our youngest disciples can play, pray, wonder, and grow—right alongside us!

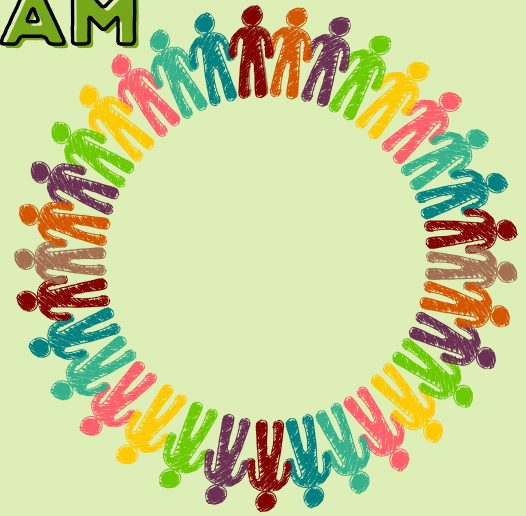
