PASTORS MESSAGE

"AND THE PEACE OF GOD, WHICH TRANSCENDS ALL UNDERSTANDING, WILL GUARD YOUR HEARTS AND YOUR MINDS IN CHRIST JESUS." - PHILIPPIANS 4:7

As I sit here writing this missive, Hurricane Erin is moving up the East coast. I've seen many videos of high winds and waves tearing up the coast line. Beaches are being washed away as well as houses, businesses and roads. When the storm passes on, the coastline will be different.

When a hurricane swirls, two realities exist at once: the calm of the eye and the fierce energy of the winds. In the eye, there is a stillness, a strange and steady peace, even while the storm rages around. In the winds, there is power, movement, force, that reshapes whatever lies in its path.



Our life in Christ is much the same. In Christ, we are held in the peace of the center, rooted in God's presence, anchored in love that does not shift even when the world does. This is the "eye" of our faith, the place where we can rest in God and faithfully prepare for what is to come.

When people prepare for a hurricane, they make hard choices like boarding up, tying down and storing what is most essential. They let go of what cannot be protected. They shift their routines and adjust their lives because the storm requires it. In the church, we are facing something similar. Financial realities are changing; we no longer have the resources we once did. That means we must prepare, too, not with fear but with faith.



At our congregational meeting on September 28, we will discern what is essential to our mission, what needs to be released, and how we can live more simply yet more faithfully as the body of Christ. In the coming months changes will happen and we will not be the same. There will be grief as some beloved things are let go of or are reduced and there will be celebration as we live more authentically into who we're called to be as St. Andrew's UCC with the resources God has provided us with to be about the ministry of Jesus Christ.

Hurricanes are scary but they draw communities together, especially in the aftermath. We need both the eye and the wind. Without the peace and steadfastness of Christ, we would be swept away. Without the Spirit's force, we would never be transformed and renewed. As a church and as followers of Jesus, the eye of our faith, may we stay centered in the peace of Christ and may we be reshaped by the winds of the Spirit, even when it changes how we live as church. I have faith that together we can weather these winds of change and come out a resurrected community of Christ.





A REFLECTION ON BACK BAY MISSIONS

The week spent at Back Bay missions was my second great experience at Back Bay. Back Bay is a well-oiled machine that provides well-organized structure to provide services and love for the guests they serve through loving people, helping others and building partnerships. Even in these trying time of less resources and losing grants and funding to government cuts, Back Bay is still finding ways to help their guests and getting creative. When volunteering and working at the mission you can see in each person love and joy to help each guest that arrives there even if they are a guest coming for a long time or are brand new at the mission.



Back Bay missions' people served are referred to as quests. Hospitality is provided in ways I couldn't have imagined. Some of that hospitality comes in the form of tough love and expectations required of guests across the board by staff such as, guests respecting themselves, other guests and staff, listening to staff and following procedures for showering, laundry, and pantry needs. One of the tasks I helped with throughout the week was showering at the Micah center along with the clothing closet. It is amazing to see how someone's mood can change by having a shower along with having clean clothing or getting new clothing to wear from the clothes closet. With showers comes an expectation that guests will use their time allotted and not waste time so as many guests as possible can get a shower that day. I also helped to make a meal for lunch for the guests, something that Back Bay has just started doing. We made Spaghetti, put the meal in take-out containers, and distributed to quests. Guests appreciated the meals and it was clear how the guests help each other through watching their interactions. A man had come that had been bitten by a spider, we had seen him sleeping outside the night before and he asked us if anyone was there, but the center had closed already. We told him to come back the next day. When he arrived the staff immediately told him he need to go to Costal Doctors, who help guests from Back Bay with medical issues. One of the other guests immediately said he would show him where the doctor's office was. Guests helping guests, people helping people that is what God's love is all about. This year I also helped at the worksite cleaning an apartment for a veteran without housing. Our team helped paint, put new flooring in as well as clean the apartment so it would be ready for move in. Three of us had a great time getting to go to Wal-Mart to buy items needed in the apartment so it was ready to move in. With our teams hard work and working through our scheduled day off on Thursday we got to see a finished product which most times isn't the case. Having the apartment finished before we left would allow the new resident to move in within a week or two. God again working through us to help others.

Back Bay served as a great inspiration for each of St. Andrew's volunteers. We could see Jesus' walking with the Back Bay volunteers in all they do, the decisions they make and the way they interact with their guests helping us to see God in everything we did too. Back bay is a community-built mission both financially and with their personnel. We too are a community-built church and a gift that St. Andrew's has been given is community. How can we use the gift of community and camaraderie to further our missions in Perkasie and to serve our neighbors?




As a mission team we discussed ways we can bring back what we have learned to Perkasie. Finding resource to possibly find a place for Code Blue/Code Red housing in Pennridge/Upper Bucks area, doing more mission closer to home, possibly a full week of different mission projects that encompasses the same ideals. 

"CLOBBER PASSAGES" BIBLE STUDY

with Pastor Barb

For many of us, Scripture is a foundational part of how we understand and live out our faith in the world. Just as there are many English translations, there are a variety of interpretations of the Scriptures, themselves. What we've learned about Scripture depends on the worldview, beliefs and mindsets of translators, interpreters, and the worldview, beliefs and mindsets of those teaching us as well as our own.

Some things I learned when I was young in Sunday school taught by very faithful and good teachers, I had to unlearn when I went to seminary. In seminary we did deeper dives into the Scripture taking into account the translations from Hebrew and Greek, the culture of the Biblical time, the motivations of the original writers, and changing interpretations due to how Scripture was used to address circumstances of the faithful in different time periods and the current time.

As we explore how we are being led to be an inclusive community and considering the LGBTQIA2S+ community as a place to start, you might be wondering what exactly does the Bible say about it? I'll be leading a series of Bible studies to engage Scripture on what is traditionally called "the clobber passages", those passages used as "prooftext" to condemn homosexuality. Let's explore it together.

At our August meeting, the Open and Affirming Committee met with Priscilla Gray-Stoll, one of the founders of the Perkasie Pride Festival. Priscilla shared with us her story and her experience of working with her church at the time, a Unitarian Universalist church in Long Island, NY, guiding them through the process of becoming a "Welcoming" church, a similar process to the UCC's Open and Affirming process. She shared how her current church is living into being a Welcoming church here in the Bucks Montgomery County area. Priscilla also told us how the Perkasie Pride Festival began, how it has grown in the years since, and how the community of Perkasie has become more open and welcoming to the LGBTQ+ community that has always been here. We look forward to welcoming Priscilla back in November to share her experience and wisdom with our wider St. Andrew's Congregation.

You're invited to join us on a field trip on Tuesday, September 9 at 6:30 PM to Zwingli UCC, 350 Wile Ave. Souderton. There we'll hear how Zwingli's congregation is living into their Open and Affirming Covenant and discussing what has changed since they've become an ONA congregation.
