PASTORS MESSAGE

LUKE 12:49-56

"DO YOU THINK, I HAVE COME TO BRING PEACE TO THE EARTH? NO, I TELL YOU, BUT RATHER DIVISION!" (LUKE 12:51)

For many of us, the church is supposed to be a place of peace, comfort, a place where everyone is welcome and there is unity. So, when Jesus speaks of fire and division, even within families, we may wonder what that means for a community like ours. We may even resist it. But perhaps this passage has something essential to say to a church facing tension and disagreement on how God is moving the church into the future.

Jesus is not celebrating conflict for conflict's sake. He is naming a truth: that the Gospel is disruptive. It challenges our priorities, our assumptions, and sometimes even our relationships. And when the church tries to avoid conflict at all costs, it can end up silencing the truth, suppressing transformation, and losing its way.

Division in the church isn't new. The early followers of Jesus experienced it. The Book of Acts is filled with stories of the disciples debating theology. The Epistles highlight the struggles churches in different communities had over culture, belief and practice. And yet, again and again, Scripture points us to a deeper unity, not one built on uniformity, but on shared identity in Christ.

That's where this passage speaks to us today. In a time when churches are divided over social issues, theological perspectives, political affiliations, and the reasons churches are losing members and why giving is down, we are being called back to the core of who we are and who we follow. Our true identity is not in our opinions or our factions, but in Jesus Christ.

Jesus brings fire not to destroy, but to refine and kindle change. He burns away the things that do not belong, our ego, our self-righteousness, our need to be right, and invites us to be shaped by the Spirit. And when we allow Christ to be the center of our identity, we can engage even our deepest differences with grace, courage, and humility, doing the hard work of listening, speaking truth, and loving one another even when we disagree. To do so we let the fire of Christ reshape who we are as church giving us clarity about who we are in Christ.

May we be a church brave enough to face the fire and faithful enough to be transformed by it.

Dear Keystone Friends,


With full hearts and joy filled spirits, we are thrilled to announce the historic passage of the motion to create the Keystone Conference of the United Church of Christ! By a vote of 98% (640 in favor, 8 opposed, 6 abstentions), delegates of the 35th General Synod approved the realignment of our Conference boundaries. This moment marks the culmination of several years of faithful discernment, courageous conversation, and a shared vision for the future of our ministry in Pennsylvania. Together, we have dared to believe that God is still speaking — and calling us into something new.

The creation of the Keystone Conference is more than a structural shift; it is a bold witness to our commitment to covenant, collaboration, and the continuing call of the Holy Spirit. We honor the legacy of those who have gone before us in each of our four Conferences and rejoice in the new pathways and possibilities now open to us. We give thanks for the Keystone Working Group, Conference staffs, and all who labored, prayed, and dreamed this into being. And we move forward with gratitude, humility, and a renewed passion for the Gospel.

We trust that the One who began a good work among us will be faithful to complete it.



A REFLECTION ON BACK BAY MISSIONS

Our newsletter last month spoke about the work that we accomplished while at Back Bay this year; however, there is always more to a mission trip. Anyone who has gone on a mission knows that it is not just about the work, it is about the relationships and the presence of the Spirit. We often say that we learn and gain more than we give and this trip was no exception. I would like to focus this article on the spiritual aspects of our trip. Thank you to Pastor Barb who led us each evening in devotions even though many nights we just wanted to go to bed. Much of what is written here is directly from her preparations. Despite our tiredness, we would spend over an hour together focused on God's teaching and sharing our personal reflections.

Our first encounter with the Spirit came on Sunday morning when we had the opportunity to meet with One Coast UCC which recently became the first UCC to return to Biloxi following the closing of the UCC church in that area in 1974. The Mission and the UCC were supportive of integration and civil rights protests in the 1960's and many of the members were arrested. Ultimately, the UCC church shut down, but the Mission remained. We met the members of the new church which is lay-led, and many were guests that used the services of the Mission. The Spirit moved freely among the people with singing and open discussion of hopes, dreams and grief.

Our evening devotions explored Matthew 5, 6 and 7 with focused verses. On Sunday, (Matthew 5:3) we learned about "spiritual humility" and our deep need for God. When we recognize our need for God, we can better serve others with compassion rather than pity. This was a great way to start the week. We can serve not from a place of power but from the heart. We asked ourselves the question, where do you recognize your need for God and how does that change how you serve other? This allowed us to move among the guests (this is what the Mission calls those they serve) and build relationships rather than just do the work.

On Monday (Matthey 5:6) we discussed our desire for justice and to heal brokenness. We observed the need for justice in Biloxi and focused on how we were doing justice work at Back Bay. We asked God to help us serve and act justly in every place He sends us. We learned that mission work is justice work.

This can happen anywhere. Where can we do justice work in Perkasie?

On Tuesday (Matthew 5:14-16) we were reminded that we are the light of the world and we looked at where God's light shines in all we do. We saw God's light in the Back Bay workers, the Volunteer Coordinators and the unsheltered folks who helped one another. We saw the light shine through our own team members. We looked at how we could let our own light shine and asked ourselves where we hide our light. What does it look like for you to shine your light and what keeps you from being the

On Wednesday (Matthew 6:25-34) we were called to let go of worry and remember that Jesus calls us to trust. By this time in a mission, this one can be very important as we wonder if we can get the work done, will everyone in the team be ok, and are we all doing what needs to be done. Will we make it the rest of the week? We looked at how God took care of us despite our worries. Where is the evidence that God is taking care of things for you?


On Thursday (Matthew 7:12) we explored the golden rule. We were invited to see others as God would see them, since we are all in His creation. We didn't just work at Back Bay, we built relationships. We were told that spending time with the guests was just as important as doing the building and cleaning and painting. We were invited to think about what we would want in their circumstances. We talked about how we can really "see" those around us. In what ways can our actions reflect how we want to be treated in our own church and community?

On Friday (Matthew 7:24-27) we focused on the fact that we didn't just build houses on this trip we built spiritual ones too. We discussed the foundations that we built on this trip. Where do we need to practice more of what Jesus taught us? Where can I stand firm and help others in my work for Him. These were the verses and topics that we explored. I invite you to look at the verses and explore the questions for yourself considering our work at St. Andrew's in Perkasie.
