PASTORS MESSAGE

ACTS 2:1-21 PENTECOST

When I was in high school, I was a part of a student exchange program. I had been taking German for two years and was a good student. However, we rarely spoke German in class. I could understand basic German when listening to people speak but I didn't have the ability to translate what I wanted to say into German, other than a few learned phrases. I remember visiting someone with the German girl I was partnered with and the woman was asking me questions in German. I was extremely embarrassed because other than the very simplest of answers, I couldn't respond to the questions. I could translate however when the woman said to my German partner, she's not very good at German.



In the story of Pentecost, one of the outcomes of the presence of the Holy Spirit is that the disciples speak in different languages and the people hear in their own language. That's a pretty amazing feat because there is nothing easy about speaking a new language. In Bible study, when we would go back to the Greek or Hebrew, we often found multiple translations to single words that required us to understand the context and nuance of the text. Often that was tricky because the culture of the times isn't fully known. Many time interpreters chose the translation that they wanted the text to say to their own time and culture.

In learning a new language you also have to learn culture, history, minds, and spiritualities so that you can take into account the nuances of the language and people you're communicating with. To become fluent, you have to be brave enough to immerse yourself in the language and fearless enough to make mistakes in speaking it.

This is what the Holy Spirit did to the disciples who were too frightened to go out into the community after Jesus died, rose and ascended. The Holy Spirit moved them out of their comfort zones, the place where they felt safe, and sent them out into the crowds in the street to speak. The Spirit set them on fire and silence was no longer possible. They had to speak the good news regardless of whether they would be received or not. They had to risk using words that felt strange on their tongues but were essential words for the time and place.


Pentecost is a story for our time. We live in a world where language has become toxic and is being used more and more to exclude people and bring suffering upon the vulnerable in our world. It's scary and our instinct is to huddle together inside our churches where it's safe and comfortable. Yet the Holy Spirit sends us out into our communities with a new word to speak for our day and age. It is the word of God's love that has the power to give life, even over death, as shown in the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is a love that breaks down barriers has the power to make us see, hear and know the other in such a way that we find ourselves caring what happens to them. We might feel vulnerable in speaking this new word of love in public; it might feel strange on our tongues but silence is no longer possible. The Holy Spirit has set us on fire with the powerful word of God's love that is essential for us to speak in our time and place.



MAY MEETING CONSISTORY REPORT

Consistory met with Associate Conference Minister Rev. Cean James and discussed the process of creating a strategic long-range plan for St. Andrews. We agreed to meet with him and other church leaders in the coming months to begin creating a strategic plan for our future.





We had previously authorized transitioning to a new web page provider associated with the UCC. This new platform will allow us more flexibility in content and provide direct links to UCC content. The new web page is expected to be up and running by the end of the month.

We noted several events coming soon that will provide additional income for the church. First, there is a rummage sale on June 7 followed by this year's first Shoo-fly and Funny Cake sale on June 21 at the Perkasie Farmer's Market. 

FINANCIAL UPDATE

Our financial reports reflect a slight decrease in total giving for the first 12 weeks of 2025. In addition, our snow removal costs, and heating oil costs show an increase over 2024 due to the significant lower temperatures and more frequent snow events in 2025 versus 2024. This has had a negative impact on our budget, and we ask everyone to prayerfully consider an additional one-time extra donation to alleviate these increased expenses.




COMMISSIONING OF MISSION TEAM




WHAT IS PRIDE MONTH?


