



This NEW exhibition opens on Friday, January 11.



A painter, lithographer, and muralist Claude Bentley was based primarily in Chicago, and was also a teacher at Layton School of Art in Milwaukee, Wisconsin and the Art Institute of Chicago. An interest in pre-Columbian culture, the Indians of Mexico and the primitive arts of Africa resulted in many visits to those places having a strong influence on his painting style.
