Gabor Peterdi: Echoes of War

Surrounded by luminary modernists of the 20th Century like Pablo Picasso and Joan Miro, Peterdi absorbed not only the technical lessons of etching and engraving, but also revealed a personal consciousness in his work of surreal images that evoke the onslaught of fear and the gathering storm clouds of war in Europe in the 1930s.

Peterdi went on to hunt Nazis in his native Hungary as an enlisted specialist for the US Army. Then, after the war, was hired by Josef Albers to teach printmaking at Yale University, where as a full Professor, he stayed for 23 years.

ON VIEW:**Politics & Religion: Artists Speak Out!**

Themes of social justice, immigration, religious symbolism, protest, and satire evoke voices of the past and reflect current precedents for the future. Since the days of Paul Revere in America or Honoré Daumier in France, artists have sought to bring forth images that might rouse the masses into thought provoking states of mindfulness or even protest. Seeing these current images in historical context as in this exhibit, provides a safe and neutral space within the museum allowing time for genuine reflection for the visitor.

Curated by Director, Brian Byrn, **Politics & Religion: Artists Speak Out!**, is a dynamic visual experience that will continue on view through June 8.

Nate Gowdy: Eyewitness

On January 6, 2021, the U.S. Capitol was transformed. History that day was shaped not only by violence on its steps, but written on the faces, gestures, and small human details of Americans who saw themselves as part of something greater: a performance of chaos, grievance, belonging.



Elkhart native Nate Gowdy moved among the crowd—not as a participant, but as a witness. As Nate Gowdy witnessed the gathering of crowds on January 6, 2021, his camera recorded images that move beyond typical journalism and are lifted into the realm of fine art. Viewed in the sanctuary of the Museum, visitors can judge the event for themselves, as the camera's lens and the photographer's eye capture the action.

Gowdy's first monograph, **INSURRECTION** (2023) is the only photo-journalistic book to document the historic moments of January 6, 2021. It has sold over 1,300 copies and will be available at the MMAA on April 26th! Come meet the artist!

MONDAY, JUNE 16

The first bus trip of the year takes us to the Art Institute of Chicago to see an engaging exhibit: *Frida Kahlo's Month in Paris: A Friendship with Mary Reynolds*.

Unveiling Frida Kahlo's work for the first time in the Art Institute galleries, this exhibition focuses on the celebrated Mexican artist's first and only trip to Europe and her brief yet pivotal encounter with Mary Reynolds, an American avant-garde bookbinder who stood at the center of a rich Parisian artistic community. The exhibit sheds light on this little-known chapter of 20th-century art history, recounting the legacies of Kahlo and Reynolds—both artists themselves and partners of artists—as they navigated Surrealism, identity, and cross-cultural exchange on the eve of World War II.




