Registrations for the application **will begin this Friday, April 30th, at 9 am eastern** and applications will officially open **on Monday, May 3rd, at noon eastern**.

### POS Service Providers and RRF Grant Applications

The Small Business Administration released the names of the point-of-sale (POS) service providers that can be utilized for Restaurant Revitalization Grant applications. It appears that only two (Square and Toast) will actually support the submission of an application, but all will provide knowledge support and gross receipts documentation (Square, Toast, Clover, and NCR/Aloha).

Once the SBA begins accepting applications, eligible restaurants can apply directly with their POS service providers. While each POS provider is helping differently – such as building pre-packaged point-of-sale documentation – all POS systems listed are helping restaurant owners with their application submission process.

While SBA encourages applicants to utilize the POS system, applicants without access to point-of-sale service providers can still submit their applications electronically at <https://restaurants.sba.gov/>

### Restaurant Recovery Fund Update - no DUNS or SAM number needed

The U.S. Small Business Administration confirmed this afternoon that applicants for the Restaurant Revitalization Grant program **will not need to register for a DUNS number or on SAM.gov.**

This is a change from early March, when it was expected that applications would require this process as they currently do under the Shuttered Venues Operators (SVO) grant program. The shift by SBA recognized the significant demand for the restaurant recovery program.
