*Lost and Found, Winter Celebration, Youth Assembly, and Kairos all follow a model that includes a Small Group for faith discussion with a team of adult leaders. At Seventh Day, every adult serves as part of a team of "Shepherds" for each "Shepherd Group" of youth which moves from one activity center to another, where the content is led by the adults at those activity centers. We do, however, need adults at Seventh Day who will serve as "Lead Shepherds" and other adults to work in those activity areas of music, drafts, drama, and movement. If you're able to lead or help with one of those activity modules, please indicate so on this form!

14 All adults who work with youth at Virginia Synod events must carefully read and respond to the following set of expectations for adults:

- Our purpose as adults working with youth is to be faithful followers of Christ for the sake of each other and the youth whom we are called to serve, to build caring and supportive relationships with them, and to be examples of faith, love, and service for them. Adults must also be good examples of church commitment, regular worship, and Christian discipleship.
- Adult participants at Synod Youth Events are part of a community of mutual support and should commit to show the encouragement, respect, and mutual consolation toward one another that is appropriate to such a community.
- Adult participants at youth events must abide by the same expectations as apply to the youth - including matters pertaining to alcohol, drug, and tobacco use - and be willing to follow the restrictions and requirements of the event schedule (large group times, lights out, etc.).
- The primary responsibility for behavior of youth at Youth Events resides with the advisors from the congregations to which the youth belong, but all adults at Youth Events are called upon to make sure that youth abide by the event expectations.
- Adults working at Virginia Synod Youth Events must not have any prior history of sexual misconduct and must not engage in inappropriate touching, suggestive or intimate conversation, or other inappropriate behavior with youth. Every adult working at Virginia Synod Youth Events must be in good standing with their local congregation. No adult who has been restricted from working with children or youth at the local level will be permitted to serve as a small group leader at a synod youth event.
