
Nursery service will be offered during Worship. If you need nursery service on Sunday morning, please let a Greeter know and they will assist you.

Sermon Notes

MARCH 30, 2025

I. Wake Up!

Revelation 3:1-6

The Church at Sardis

A. A tale of two cities.

1. The word Sardis is a plural noun and the city of Sardis was made up of two cities, one in the valley and one on the high peak and plateau above it.
 - a. The river that ran through the valley was, in ancient times, apparently, rich in gold. Under its famous King Croesus, it became astoundingly wealthy and, because of its location on the high peak, nearly impregnable.
2. Despite its advantageous location, Sardis would be captured and fall twice, once to the Persians under Cyrus and later to a regional ruler, Antiochus.
 - a. In both battles, they were defeated because they failed to maintain a guard at the top of the peak.
3. *"I know your deeds; you have a reputation of being alive, but you are dead. Wake up!"*
 1. Just as the city had fallen asleep on the watch, the church had also fallen asleep.
 2. Jesus, "who holds the seven Spirits of God (Isaiah 11:2) and the seven stars" (the seven churches) calls on them to repent (v. 3).
 - a. They have been careless and failed to finish the work that God has called them to do.
 - b. They have been resting on their reputation of being alive when, according to Jesus, they are dead (vv. 1-2).
 - c. There is no mention of heresies or challenges from false leaders/teachers. They have deteriorated from within, from their own sin of lethargy. Remember and repent (v. 3).
 3. Consequences.
 - a. I will come like a thief when you least suspect (v. 3). Just like what happened in their city's history.
 4. A word to the faithful (those without soiled clothes – v. 4).
 - a. "They will walk with me, dressed in white for they are worthy" (v. 4).
 - b. This may be a reference to the white robe of their baptism and indicate Jesus' continuing celebration of the faithful as our Mediator before the Father (v. 5).
