

Making Sure

John 14:8-17, 25:27

A. Context.

- Thomas has just blurted out his desperate question, "How can we know the way?"
 Jesus responded, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the
 Father except through Ne."
- 2. But that's not enough for Philip.
 - a. Philip is a mediator/organizer/clarifier. He brings a skeptical Nathanael (Bartholomew) to meet Jesus (John 1). He dramatically informs Jesus that they don't have enough food to feed the crowds (John 6). Later, at Passover time, he will be the mediator (along with Andrew) who brings the Greeks to meet Jesus (John 12:20-22).
 - Now, he presumes to clarify Jesus' dramatic statement regarding His oneness with the Father (v. 8).
 - c. It does not appear that Philip's comment is a rebellious one, but it is clear by his response that Jesus is disappointed in Philip and the others for their failure to "get it." "Don't you know Me, even after I have been among you such a long time?" – v. 4.
- B. Jesus uses this awkward moment as an opportunity to instruct them about the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Spirt of truth (v. 17), the Advocate (v. 25).
 - We need to remember that the apostles/disciples are not strangers to the ministry of the Holy Spirit. Jesus is reminding them and clarifying for them (and for us) things that He has already taught them and they have experienced.
 - It is ironic that Jesus' enemies often understood what Jesus was teaching regarding.
 His relationship with the Father. They wanted to kill Him for it, but now Philip and the others are missing it.
 - Jesus proceeds to share several clues and signposts so that they can continue the ministry of the kingdom of God with adequate and genuine confidence.
 - a. "I am in the Father and the Father is in Me" (v. 10).
 - b. "Whoever believes in Me will do the works I have been doing" (v. 12).
 - c. "Ask for anything in My name, and I will do it" (v. 14).
 - All of this will be given through the Spirit of truth, Your advocate who will live with You and be in You forever (vv. 16-17).
 - 4. The primary means of continuing the work of the kingdom is to "love Me and keep My commands" (v. 15). This attention to obedience as a power source for growth and ministry is prevalent throughout Jesus' Last Supper discourse.
- C. Jesus concludes this part of His teaching with the same assurance with which He began, "Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid" (v. 27.).
 - 1. The Holy Spirit will teach you and remind you of everything.
 - The Father will send Him in My name, not as a temporary presence, but as a permanent presence in your life.

Are we ready to set out and trust him?
