Sermon Notes

FEBRUARY 23, 2025

I. Back in Business

Nehemiah 6:15-16; 8:1-10

A. A brief summary.

1. Nehemiah arrives in Jerusalem with full support of the king including a military presence and resources for supplies and appointment as governor.
2. A ride in the dark to assess the project of building the city wall and its gates.
3. Enthusiastic reception by the leaders of the Jewish people.
4. The work begins.
 - a. Various families, individuals, and people groups take responsibility for specific gates and sections of the walls. "Like an extended CLPC work day!"
 - b. As with the temple project, the resistance movement rises up and they make threats to kill the workers. Nehemiah orders the workers to arm themselves and protect each other while they work, and to remain in the city to protect it by night (4:21-23).
 - c. The enemies hatch a plot to intimidate Nehemiah, but he courageously resists their threats.

B. Nehemiah 6:15 - "So the wall was completed on the twenty-fifth of Elul, in fifty-two days."

1. Many of the exiles, beginning with the leaders, settled in Jerusalem. Others were chosen by lot to live in the city and build homes so the city would be safe.

C. The Law of Moses is reestablished (8:1-10).

1. All the people (men and women and all who could understand - 8:2) gathered before the Water Gate.
2. Ezra the priest, along with a contingent of Levites, stood on a high platform and began to read the Law.
 - a. The Levites, then, went among the people and made sure everyone understood.
3. As the people heard and learned what the Law commands, they begin to weep (8:9) because of their conviction of sin.
 - a. Nehemiah comforted them (v. 10), but, during his second term as governor, he, along with Ezra the priest, reestablished the Law of Moses, often with great force and authority, throughout the land of Israel.

Silent Preparation

If you think about the characteristics of Nehemiah's leadership revealed in this chapter, you will find a single theme threaded throughout: unselfishness. Unconcerned about having his name in lights, Nehemiah stepped aside and strengthened the overall project with fresh reinforcements - people like Ezra who was better than he in the handling of the Scripture. And as Ezra did his job, Nehemiah stood among the people applying the truth that was proclaimed. It posed no problem for him to step aside and have his wall project virtually ignored because a far more significant activity was taking place among the people. Why? His mind-set was unselfish.
