Sermon Notes

MARCH 2, 2025

I. Aglow

Luke 9:28-36

- A. The Transfiguration casts a shadow which leads us into the season of Lent and calls all of us to make the final journey to Jerusalem with Jesus.
1. A time of confusion and despair.
 - a. The Transfiguration immediately follows Jesus' rebuke of Peter for refusing to accept the announcement of His impending death.
 - b. Peter, quite obviously, is hurting as he climbs the mountain with his friends and, most likely, they are experiencing a similar dread.
 2. Moses and Elijah confirm Jesus' departure (v. 31).
 3. Lent – a period of 40 days (not including Sundays) which begins the Wednesday after the Day of Transfiguration.
 - a. A significant part of the life of the church since at least the 4th century, it is a time for repentance, sacrifice, study, reflection and good works.
 - b. A time during which we learn more deeply why Jesus died on the cross for us and in which we grow in gratitude for His sacrifice and obedience on our behalf.
- B. The Transfiguration provides a light of hope for the disciples as they join Jesus for the final trip to Jerusalem.
1. They do not witness a defeated Jesus, but instead "they saw His glory" (v. 32), "the appearance of His face changed, and His clothes became dazzling white" (v. 29).
 2. Moses and Elijah do not appear as commiserators, but instead, also reflect the light of glory (v. 31). They speak of His departure not as defeat, but as the fulfillment of victory.
 3. Peter still does not fully comprehend what he's witnessing and begins to speak without understanding (v. 33), but he does understand that it is good (v. 33).
- C. The Transfiguration provides the most crucial instruction for those who would follow Christ.
1. The voice of the Father – "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to Him!"
 2. Jesus performs the first sign of his revealed glory at Cana and it is accompanied by Mary's instruction to the servants, "Do whatever He tells you" (John 2:5), i.e., "listen to Him".
 3. Lent is a time for sharpening the hearing of our hearts and minds and deepening our commitment to put what we hear into action through the grace and power of the Holy Spirit.
