Sermon Notes

MARCH 9, 2025

I. Forsaking Our First Love

Revelation 2:1-7

The Church at Ephesus

A. Known as the greatest and wealthiest city in the province of Asia (think NYC).

1. Largest harbor – the marketplace of the world – everything came through Ephesus from all directions. Because of its strategic location, it was known as the Highway to Rome.
2. A free city – no Roman troops stationed there; self-governing.
3. The center for the worship of Artemis (Diana), the temple for which was one of the seven wonders of the world. It was also the home of many other pagan temples.
4. A reputation for being a wild and evil place.
5. Despite all of these factors, it was probably the strongest and most influential church in the ancient world.
 - a. Paul had a special affection for the Ephesians.
 - b. The apostle John spent his later days there and the tradition is that Mary, the mother of Jesus, lived with him there.

B. The message to the church of Ephesus.

1. The source – it is established in chapter 1 that these messages to the 7 churches come from the risen Christ.
2. Begins with a list of attributes regarding the church at Ephesus.
 - a. A hard-working church (v. 2).
 - b. A persistent church (v. 2).
 - c. A faithful, pure and holy church – “cannot tolerate wicked people” (v. 2), weeds out false teachers/apostles (v.2).
 - d. Longsuffering, remaining vibrant (v.3).
3. “Yet, I hold this against you” (v. 4).
 - a. “You have forsaken the love you had at first” (v. 4).
 - b. Love, for Christ, love for others or both?
 - c. The apostolic teaching and Christ’s teaching is that the two are entwined. You can’t/don’t have one without the other.
4. The commanded response and consequences.
 - a. Remember and repent! Turn around and “do the things you did at first” (v. 3).
 - b. If you refuse, I will remove “your lampstand from its place” (v. 5). Your church will either be destroyed or lose its life.
 - c. Attaboy! Keep hating the practices of the Nicolaitans which I also hate (v. 6).
 - d. Reward – Life itself ... beginning now and in the heavenly kingdom.
