

Promises, Promises

Deuteronomy 34:1-12

- A. You have to be familiar with the whole story.
 - A promise at Ur (Abraham), at Moriah, at Bethel, in Egypt, in the burning bush, at the Red Sea, in the wilderness.
 - In spite of the sins of His people, through His overflowing grace, God keeps His promises.
- B. There have, however, been consequences when the people have not responded faithfully and broken their promises.
 - Because of his rash behavior at Meribah (Numbers 20, Dt. 3:23-26; 32:48-52), Moses, as well as Aaron and Miriam, will not lead the people into the Promised Land.
 - After reaffirming the Law and promises to the people for the second time (Deuteronomy - giving of the Law), Moses passes the mantle of prophetic leadership to Joshua.
- C. In chapter 34, the Lord directs Moses to climb Mt. Nebo so that he might see the Land of Promise, "the whole land" (v. 1), as promised by God.
 - 1. God is holy and perfectly faithful to His promises.
 - Observations.
 - a. Moses was in excellent health (120 years old 3 generations) v. 7.
 - b. No one knows the nature of his death or where he is buried. "He (the Lord) buried him in Moab, in the valley opposite Beth Peor" (v. 5).
 - c. He was one of a kind (vv. 10ff.).
- D. We are still realizing the inheritance of the Promise that was passed on through Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Moses.
 - We have experienced what they could only begin to imagine "In the
 past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and
 in various ways, but in these last days He has spoken to us by His Son,
 whom He appointed heir of all things, and through whom also He made
 the universe" (Hebrews 1:1-2).
 - This is more than the great view Moses had from Mt. Nebo. And God is not finished yet! He has promised that He will come again and gather all who love Him into the heavenly kingdom.
