The Light of the World (1851-1854), by William Hunt Holman, representing the figure of Jesus preparing to knock on an overgrown and long-unopened door, illustrating Revelation 3:20: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if any man hear My voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with Me". The door in the painting has no handle, and can therefore be opened only from the inside, representing "the obstinately shut mind". The painting was considered by many to be the most important and culturally influential rendering of Christ of its time.

Sermon Notes

APRIL 6, 2025

I. Either One or the Other

Revelation 3:14-22

The Church at Laodicea (on the Lycus)

A. A thriving commercial city because major roads passed through it. Because of the geography of the region, the roads that led from Ephesus and Pergamum to the east and to the northern Mediterranean coast went through Laodicea. It was the only way to avoid the steeper ascents through the mountain range.

1. As the Roman empire developed and peace prevailed in the region, Laodicea, which was previously a small fortress, began to boom with prosperity.
2. The city became known for three major activities.
 - a. It was a financial and banking center (think Sioux Falls, SD or Wilmington, DE). Its wealth was augmented by the heavy Jewish population whose temple tax produced an unusually distinctive wealth and influence.
 - b. It was a center for clothing manufacturing (their sheep had violet-black wool!).
 - c. It was a medical center, particularly famous for ointments for the ears and the eyes.
3. It accomplished these things despite few natural springs to provide a water supply of its own. Water had to be brought in by underground aqueducts from miles away.

B. This is the only church about which the Lord has nothing good to say.

1. "You are lukewarm" (v. 16). Distasteful to the Lord, just as the lukewarm water brought in by aqueducts is distasteful to them.
2. You think you're rich, but you're poor; you think you're finely clothed, but you're naked; you think that your medicines have preserved your sight, but you're blind.
3. Repent! So I can make you rich, give you clothes to wear, and enable you to see!
4. The invitation: "I stand at the door and knock." E.g., William Holman Hunt painting, "The Light of the World" (v. 20).
5. The victory (v.21) – "At the right hand of God the Father Almighty!"
