Where is it?

The Solidarity Walk begins at the corner of Adams and B.B. King (167 Adams Avenue) and concludes at the National Civil Rights Museum (450 Mulberry Street).

What is it?

The day of action consists of a Downtown Memphis Solidarity Walk to **#TeachTruth** about U.S. history. In the walk, we'll explore Memphis landmarks that the bill passed by the TN State Legislature and signed into law on May 24th would restrict how educators teach to children.

When is it?

Saturday, June 12th

The Solidarity Walk begins promptly at **10:30 am**, and we expect to be done no later than **noon**.

WHY?

On May 24th, Tennessee passed a law that intimidates teachers into lying to students about the roles that racism, sexism, and oppression have played throughout U.S. history. As a part of a National Day of Action against similar laws, we'll take a tour of Memphis to highlight historical markers that the new law would force Memphis teachers to lie or omit facts about. We **cannot** and **will not** be silent.
