The Board of the NSW Wine Industry Association held its second meeting for 2021 on the 19th of April in Sydney.

Introduction

Since the last Board meeting held in February, there has been increased activity and success around the short and medium term goals and objectives set by NSW wine.

In particular our main goal of securing a new memorandum of understanding with the NSW government including specific support and funds for the NSW Wine industry was successfully signed this month.

Now that vintage operations are drawing to a close, we wish to enact a schedule of events and activities organised by NSW Wine to update, educate and inform industry members with several of these opportunities included in this communique.

NSW Wine continues to advocate strongly on behalf of the wine industry, and we wish to urge all regional associations and members across the state to take advantage of the opportunities that have been negotiated on your behalf.

MoU

It is with great pleasure that we wish to inform you that NSW wine industry association has achieved one of its main goals for the year, in the signing of a new Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the NSW Government that includes financial support specifically for our industry up until June 2023.

The MoU was officially signed by Deputy Premier Barilaro (on behalf of the NSW government) and NSW Wine President Mark Bourne (on behalf of the NSW wine industry association) on Thursday 15th April at Leogate Estate Wines in the Hunter Valley leading into an international trade function.

This new MoU is valued at an additional \$600,000/yr +gst and is targeted at increasing exports alongside domestic marketing & promotion support for the NSW wine industry.

The MoU is an agreement confirming in writing the support we currently receive from the NSW government through existing programs, as well as outlining agreed areas of new focus and funding between with the NSW wine industry. The two areas of new focus will be developing new export markets for NSW wine producers to increase the value and volume of wine exported with a NSW GI, and growing domestic demand for NSW wines via an industry development and growth program fund.

This successful team effort is a significant outcome for the NSW wine industry that will put us on a more equal footing with other states who receive similar assistance in export and domestic programs, and importantly allow us to plan for the future growth of the NSW wine industry.

We look forward to discussing the new opportunities with regional associations in the very near future and also rolling out these new programs asap.

National Wine Industry bushfire conference

NSW Wine Innovation Forum

The NSW wine innovation forum has been held for 5 years with the support of Wine Australia and the NSW DPI. This year the forum will be held in Griffith NSW on the 22nd and 23rd June.

The forums aim is to gather the leading innovative thinkers and producers for two days, in order to identify and outline the priorities for research development and extension for the NSW wine industry.

This year's forum will focus on the R&D areas of biosecurity, renewal and sustainability. We Invitations have been issued to identified innovative producers and researchers and we are looking forward to again successfully delivering the only event of this type in the Australian wine industry.

AgSkilled Program

NSW Wine successfully advocated for the NSW wine industry to be part of the NSW government \$15m AgSkilled 2.0 program for the next three years, with the program was initially targeted at plant/viticulture production sector. We are pleased to inform you that after successfully advocacy by NSW Wine, the programs eligibility of courses and participants has now been widened for the NSW wine industry.

There will be a series of newly approved courses circulated very soon that will be broader and covering the areas of viticulture, cellar operations, cellar door operations, board governance, business management and marketing. We will be distributing the next raft of available free courses to all industry participants and urge all to make the most of this unique opportunity to upskill our workforce.
