ATTENTION: Northampton County Residents / Businesses

Tropical Cyclone/Storm Isaias brought with it large amounts of moisture across Northampton County and the surrounding counties. Today as the flood waters recede, we ask that all residents and businesses within the county inspect their homes / facilities for any damages due to wind or rain. These documented damages can go a long way with helping to obtain potential disaster declaration monies to help repair / rebuild your damaged home or business.

If you have exterior or interior damage to your home, business or property due to impact(s) of Tropical Cyclone/Storm Isaias please notify your municipality immediately so they can begin documenting these damages. All municipalities have a designated Local Emergency Management Coordinator (EMC) who should be made aware of these damages, which they will then document and report up to our agency.

Some information to have ready when you contact your municipality or report damages is:

- Homeowners name and a good contact phone number/email
- Address of your residence/business
- If you received water in your home/business how high did the water get?
- Are you still in your home/business?
- Do you need assistance with cleaning the inside of your home? (help may be available by outside volunteer agencies)
- Do you have insurance that may cover flood damage such as National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) backed flood insurance?
