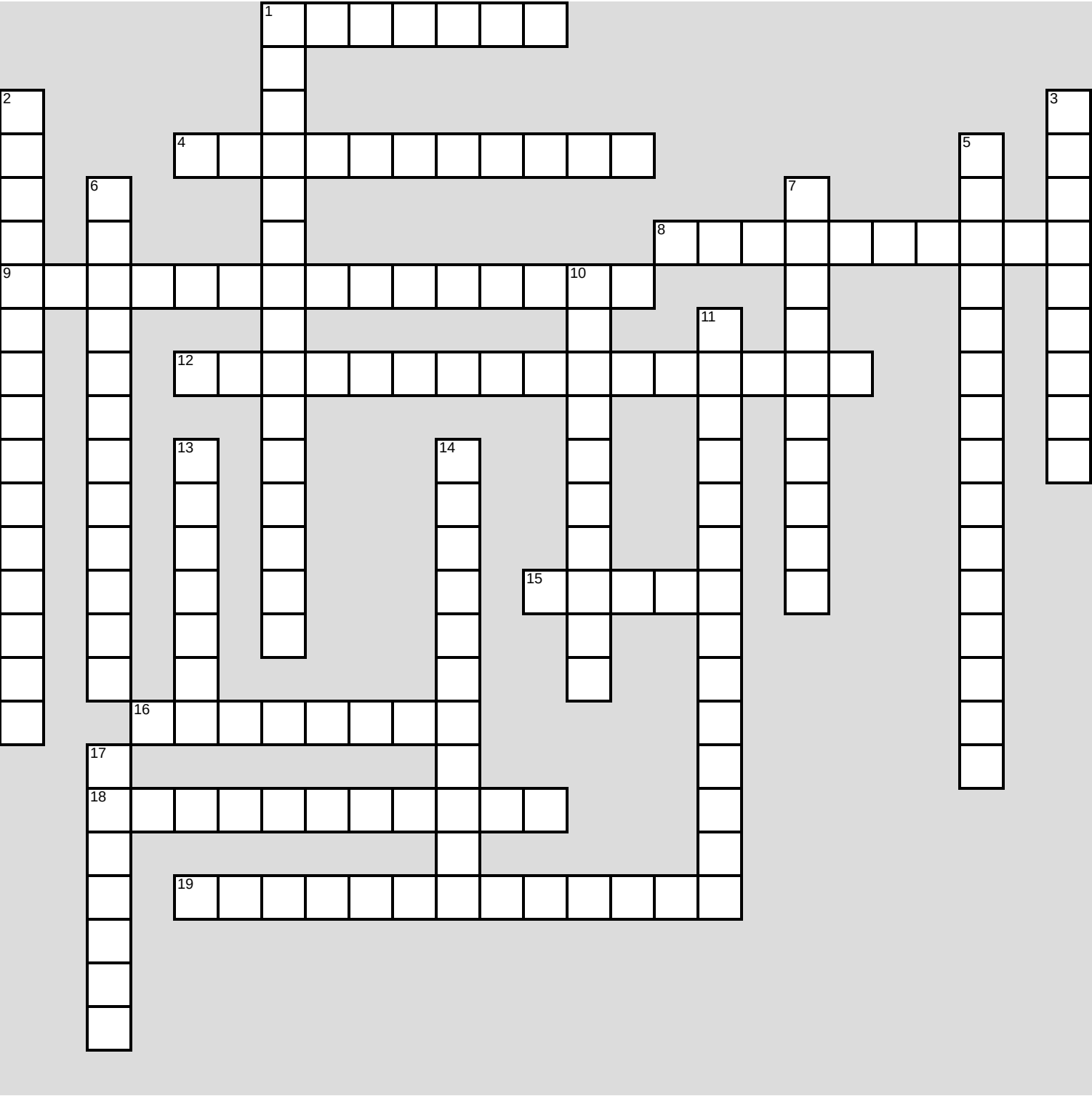


# Health Care



## Across

- 1 The amount of money an individual who wants health care coverage must pay to an insurer, health plan or Medicare.
- 4 A hospice service that provides relief for caregivers of hospice patients.
- 8 A sudden illness or injury that needs immediate medical attention.
- 9 A medical term referring to a disease that cannot be cure and is expected to lead to death withing six months.
- 12 Health care costs that you must pay because Medicare or other insurance does not cover them.
- 15 The Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act provides new rights and protections for members of group health care plans.
- 16 A federally funded, state-run program that covers medical expenses for people with low or limited incomes.
- 18 A hospice service that provides relief for caregivers of hospice patients.
- 19 Care for a person in the hospital overnight.

- 1 Exercise and physical activities used to condition muscles and improve levels of activity.
- 2 Legal document that allows you to appoint another person to make health care decisions for you.
- 3 A person whose condition makes it difficult to leave home without considerable effort. A doctor must certify this condition.
- 5 A protection purchased to help pay for medical expenses related to health or sickness.
- 6 Assistance with activities of daily living such as bathing, feeding, and toileting.
- 7 The prevention, treatment, and management of illness and the maintenance of mental and physical well-being through services offered by medical and health care professionals.
- 10 A doctor who specializes in treating only a certain part of the body or a certain condition, such as a cardiologist or nephrologist.
- 11 A worker who helps a patient at home with daily living activities.
- 13 Health care program for active duty and retired military personnel and their family members.
- 14 Medically responsible and necessary care performed by a skilled nurse or therapist.
