A READING FROM THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES

[16:16-34]

With Paul and Silas, we came to Philippi in Macedonia, a Roman colony, and, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation." She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour. But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe." The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks. About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners

were listening to them. Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" They answered, "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

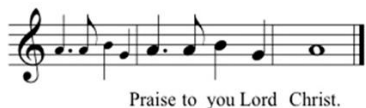

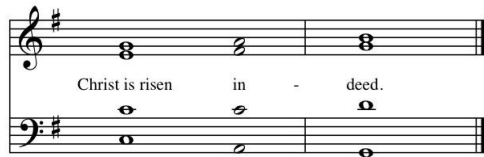
THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE *Sam Cucci, Cantor.*

And so, Father, we who have been redeemed by him, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring before you these gifts. Today's music features the anthem "Thou O God art Praised in Zion" composed by English composer Malcolm Boyle (1902-1976). Born in Windsor, Boyle served as a chorister at Eton College and at age 17 was appointed Organist and Choirmaster of Holy Trinity Garrison Church, Windsor. He later served as Assistant Organist at St. George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, under Sir Henry Walford Davies. After earning degrees from the Royal Academy of Music in London, he went on to become the Cathedral Organist at Chester Cathedral. This morning's anthem is one of his most prolific within the Anglican Communion and for many years remained unpublished until a former chorister of Chester Cathedral, Dr. George Guest, wrote it down from memory.

Boyle's powerful and beautiful setting of texts from Psalms 65 and 67 and Isaiah 23 is being sung this morning in observance of Ascensiontide.

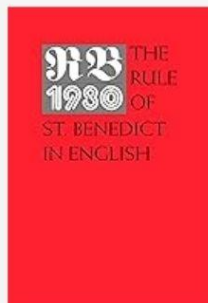
UNDERSTANDING THE BENEDICTINE SPIRITUAL TRADITION

Have you ever wondered how to gain more balance, more stability, and more integrity in life while also growing spiritually?

The Benedictine spiritual tradition has offered a way to find new life and spiritual transformation in community for the past 1500 years.

In this course, we will read two books: Esther de Waal's **Seeking God: The Way of St. Benedict**, as well as **RB 1980: The Rule of St. Benedict in English**, by Timothy Fry. Note: Please buy the slim booklet form of this publication, which is typically sold for \$3.95 via most online booksellers.

There is another book that has the same title by the same author that is the annotated edition of Benedict's Rule, but it is 627 pages long, it usually sells for around \$35, and it isn't recommended for purchase unless you have a strong desire to become a Benedictine oblate.
