


WHO CAN HOST AN EXPERIENCE WITH SASKATCHEWAN OPEN FARM DAYS?

Hosts for Saskatchewan Open Farm Days range from passionate farmers, producers, to culinary schools, chefs and local food suppliers all who aim to offer an authentic, immersive experience centered around farm life or local culinary experiences. Ideal hosts are those willing to provide a genuine snapshot of their daily operations, showcasing the processes, products, and dedication behind Saskatchewan's agricultural and local food. The event is an excellent platform for these hosts to not only display their hard work and products but also to educate and engage visitors to offer a deeper understanding of the origins of Saskatchewan food and the richness of the Province's farming story.



Farmers / Producers

Farm operations that have not yet developed a tourism experience, but are interested in participating in the Open Farm Days event, or developing a year-round agritourism experience.



Accommodation

Hoteliers, Air Bnb, unique overnight stay experiences, campgrounds, and Bed & Breakfasts, that have a package or feature local food and ingredients in some way.



Tour Operators

Tour operators who have created a local food and ag experience to promote the region typically would include a package with transportation, host and tastings.



Agritourism Attraction

A business that links agricultural production and/or processing with tourism to attract visitors onto a farm, ranch, or other agricultural business.



Finished Food Products

Products that have been grown, packaged and are available for purchase in Saskatchewan.



Markets

Farmers markets that offer local food and wares from across the province.



Retailers

Food and beverage retail stores that offer local products for sale. This could also be partnered with a tasting event, or showcase of a local producer / product.



Restaurants

Culinary experiences that service locally sourced dining experiences with local ingredients.



Beverage Producers

Beverage producers specializing in bottling Saskatchewan beverage products such as soda, wine, and beer.



Cooking Schools

Saskatchewan-based institution or business devoted to education in the art and science of cooking and food preparation.
