

WSCGA Player of the Year Selection Guidelines

1. The Point System is a guide for players who will be considered for the WSCGA Player of the Year (POY) and WSCGA Senior Player of the Year (SPOY). The ultimate selection will rest with the WSCGA Player of Year Committee.
2. Players must be a member of the Women's South Carolina Golf Association and have Amateur Status at the time the points are earned. Players will not lose previously earned points if their status or membership changes during the year.
3. Points will be earned based on the chart below. *For any player that is playing in a non-WSCGA and/or non-USGA event, that player must notify the Player Programs Manager with official results and tournament information to determine if points will be given.*
4. For all Match Play events, a match must be won to receive points. A match may be won by an outright win, concession or forfeit. A bye is not considered a win.
5. Ties: For any ties, players will split the place points they have won. (Example: if two players are tied for 2nd place, they will split points for the 2nd and 3rd place.)
6. A player must be at least 50 years old at the time of play in order to earn points toward Senior Player of the Year.
7. Each player must have three competition days in WSCGA events and be a member of the WSCGA through out the year to be eligible. At minimum she can play in a three day championship or a two-day championship plus a WSCGA one-day event or three one-day events to be eligible for the WSCGA Player of the Year and WSCGA Senior Player of the Year.
8. For any partner/team matches, players will split points equally. *
9. South Carolina Women's Open Overall Winner in Open and Senior Division will receive 200 point bonus.**
10. Tournaments open to all ages, points will be awarded for Player of the Year and Senior Player of the Year categories. Events open to just Seniors, points will be awarded to Senior Player of the Year standings only.
11. All points are based on Gross score finish.
