Dave Taylor, Viewfield farm, Chair BC Dairy Association





Dave Taylor is the Chairman of the BC Dairy Association and a Director with Dairy Farmers of Canada. He is a passionate advocate for the BC and national dairy industry.

He and his brother operate Viewfield Farm in the Comox Valley on Vancouver Island, although the success of their farm also lies with those in supportive roles, and that involves three generations of Taylors at this time.

The Taylors boast the Top Quality Milk award for Vancouver Island for 8 of the last 10 years and have been in the top 5 herds for milk quality in the province each of the past 5 years.

In 2008, Dave and and his wife Lisa represented their farm in competition in BC, and then nationally in Calgary, where they were awarded the Canadian Outstanding Young Farmers Award for 2008.

The Taylors have been dairy farming since Dave's grandfather bought his first farm in 1946 in Saanichton, just outside of Victoria, BC. They milk 130 cows and have a total inventory of over 300 registered Holsteins.
